

GULF COAST RESOURCE CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

Public Law 87-703, Food and Agriculture Act of 1962

Established:

The Secretary of Agriculture approved the Gulf Coast Resource Conservation and Development Council in March 1993. The organization is sponsored by the County Commissions and the Soil and Water Conservation Districts in Baldwin, Escambia, and Mobile Counties in the State of Alabama, and the Poarch Band of Creek Indians.

Purpose:

To provide local leadership in developing and carrying out an action-oriented plan to conserve, develop, and utilize the natural resources for the betterment of social, economic, and environmental conditions of the area.

Board Appointment:

The Mobile County Commission appoints a Council Member and notifies the Gulf Coast Resource Conservation and Development Council of its appointment no later than December 1 of the year before the member takes office.

The newly appointed Council Member shall appoint a Proxy no later than January 1 who will serve the same term of office as the newly appointed Council Member.

Term:

Two (2) years. The term begins on January 1 of the year.
