

April 11, 2016

MOBILE COUNTY COMMISSION

The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Government Plaza Auditorium, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, April 11, 2016, at 10:00 A. M. The following members of the Commission were present: Jerry L. Carl, President, Merceria Ludgood and Connie Hudson, Members. Also present were John F. Pafenbach, County Administrator/Clerk of the Commission, Jay Ross, County Attorney, and Joe W. Ruffer, County Engineer. President Carl chaired the meeting.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Reverend Stephen Sohe, Priest, Saint Joseph Catholic Church, 1703 Dublin Street, Mobile, Alabama.

Mayor Pro Tem Tom Williams, City of Satsuma, Alabama:

Thanks to the Commissioners for all they do throughout the length and breadth of Mobile County, we all benefit from it. On April 8, 2016, I attended a meeting with some of the Mayors of Mobile County, and Representative Chris Pringle presented House Bill 371. This bill will change some of the Mobile County Personnel Board regulations on hiring employees. The changes will in no way affect the merit status of employees. We appreciate our good employees in the City of Satsuma, and we don't wish to do anything that will adversely affect any employees under the Mobile County Merit System. If House Bill 371 were to pass; we will not have to ask for a list, wait for the list and then hire from the list which takes weeks and weeks. We can recruit and hire our own employees to expedite this process. Each municipality will be subject to annual audits to make sure they have followed all the regulations of the Mobile County Personnel Board.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl:

One of the frustrations I have is encouraging people to get jobs with the County and about the time they get through the month and a half process, they already have found another job. It affects both ends of the stick, not just on hiring, but also on getting a job.

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Alabama Representative Chris Pringle: Good morning, it's a pleasure to be here, it's my first time to visit with y'all. House Bill 371 was brought to me by Dr. Eichold in an attempt to expedite the hiring process for county agencies. House Bill 371 will create a new section of the Mobile County Civil Service System. This section will allow the appointing authorities to handle internally recruiting and hiring of their employees. The appointing authorities making this election will notify the Director of the Personnel Board and provide a copy of their human resource policies and procedures manual which shall include personnel policy guidelines, operational standards, employee management, hiring and termination procedures, equal employment opportunities and harassment policies. The appointing authorities making this election will be subject to annual audits to ensure they are in compliance with all the Mobile County Personnel Board Laws and Regulations. House Bill 371 will allow the appointing authorities to purchase excess annual leave at the end of the calendar year that could be paid to an employee in case of death, resignation or removal. The appointing authorities will be allowed to pay employees at the end of each year to encourage them to work during the month of December. House Bill 371 adds to the definition of Unclassified Service employees, the ones who are funded by federal or private grants and it allows layoffs to be determined by the appointing authorities depending on their critical need for the position and service ratings of employees.

Commissioner Hudson: Did you say there would be an annual audit by the Personnel Board to make sure all the regulations are followed?

Representative Pringle: Yes ma'am. All the protections for the current employees will stay in place. The appointing authorities will have a Human Resources Department, but they will follow all of the protections that are currently in place. For instance, if an appointing authority wanted to terminate an employee, they would have to follow the procedures of the Mobile County Personnel Board for proper termination.

Commissioner Hudson: What is the status of the bill right now?

Representative Pringle: Right now it has not gone very far in the House of Representatives, it's still pending in Mobile County Legislative Delegation.

Commissioner Hudson: So you need to get it out of the Local Delegation with a favorable recommendation?

Representative Pringle: Yes ma'am.

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Commissioner Hudson: Do you sense that you have support?

Representative Pringle: I have support and opposition. We're trying to explain what the bill does exactly and not what it is perceived to do.

Commissioner Ludgood: I can't say that I oppose it, I haven't read the bill or paid attention to it. When it comes to the Mobile County Personnel Board, there is some history, and for me, anytime anybody wants to tamper with it; it raises the specter of what the Personnel Board once was, and that is it discriminated against minorities and other people of color just like what was happening in other sectors. There has been movement over the years to try to deal with it. First, there was a rule of three (3) where they only certified three (3) people, and then we got the rule of ten (10) to try to get more minority applicants who couldn't make it on the list. This bill says you can go out, recruit and hire. I don't know where the safeguards are. The annual audit may be the safeguard, I'm not for sure, but to me, it's like closing the barn door after the horse has bolted. For instance, you did the audit, and you found out that people were discriminated against, how would you fix it?

Representative Pringle: This bill does say, all the requirements of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) will stay in place.

Commissioner Ludgood: There is no central place for monitoring, you will have to go to every single municipality to figure out how to do it. I understand the frustrations of how long it takes to get a list, but for me to support it, I would have to be assured we have safeguards in place. I would need to be sure we are not putting ourselves in a position where municipalities could go back to the bad old days; when they were hiring friends, friends of friends, friends' kids and then, they were pushing out significant segments of the community.

Representative Pringle: Yes ma'am. I will gladly work with you. The bill was brought to me; I'm just the conduit trying to help the Mayors and the Health Department streamline the process on hiring people.

Commissioner Hudson: If there is a fair and equitable way to address those concerns, I think it is a very good idea. We need to give our municipalities, and we as a County, need the tools to hire people to fill positions. That's a big problem we all have, and if there is a way that we can move forward and address it, I would be supportive as long as the concerns are brought forward and addressed to the people's satisfaction.

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Representative Pringle: I would gladly work with y'all on those issues.

Commission President Carl: Is it one hundred percent (100%) of the local vote?

Representative Pringle: Yes. Two (2) members of the House of Representatives can contest the local bill and kill it, and one (1) member of the Senate can kill it.

Commission President Carl: My biggest rub with this is not of a hiring standpoint, but it's personnel. I have encouraged people to get jobs with the County and a month and a half later when they finally get a call or work through the bureaucracy; they already have found a job somewhere else. It affects both ends, and it has been very hampering. Some of our hiring staff have said when they get the list; it's already outdated. It's a good idea; we've got to work through some of the details.

Representative Pringle: We'll work together.

Commissioner Hudson: Let us know how we can help you.

Representative Pringle: I sure will.

Gary Cooper, 1208 Palmetto Street, Mobile, Alabama:

Thank you for allowing me to speak today. My purpose is to show support for those individuals who are attempting to bring about changes that will improve the Mobile County Personnel Board. I don't have the details, and I don't know what exactly should be done or should not be done, but I can remember the days when I found out that certain tests scores were being changed after tests were taken. I held a press conference in front of the Mobile County Personnel Board that brought about some changes. Many things need to be done, and my only recommendation is to study them. By changing it in a positive way will make our community a much better place.

Dr. Bernard Eichold, Mobile County Health Officer:

The Mobile County Health Department is celebrating its 200th Year Birthday and I have brought a 200th Year Birthday Celebration Pin for each of the Commissioners. Mobile County celebrated its 200th Birthday in 2012, and the City of Mobile celebrated its 300th Birthday in 2002, it is the second oldest city in the United States. The Mobile County Health Department has several pieces of pending legislation before the Alabama Legislature. A plumbing legislation which will allow the County Building Inspection Department

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to review all components of construction except for the septic tank, House Bill 285 and Senate Bill 290. We have been communicating with Mr. Ruffer, who has talked about having a single point for permitting. We jointly built a building with the County Commission years ago so we could have One Stop Permitting. House Bill 285 and Senate Bill 290 will allow plumbing inspections to be part of the County. It does not require the County to do it, but it allows them the opportunity, and it negates the Mobile County Health Department of all plumbing inspections. We requested House Bill 371 through Representative Chris Pringle. Year 1939, was when the original Act passed that created the Mobile County Personnel Board, it precedes World War II. The Berlin Wall has come down since then. We now have the internet; we now have digital television; we have passed the Civil Rights Bill, which was a great piece of legislation. We have had a man on the moon, and we now have jet airplanes. A lot has changed in the world since year 1939, and I commend the legislature for thinking about updating it. This legislation will allow appointing authorities to use existing rules to hire individuals directly with an audit. If anybody has a problem, it would quickly come to the attention of the Personnel Board. Just like when people aren't happy with things in the County, they quickly bring them to the attention of the County Commissioners. We have no real problems with people communicating today; we have Facebook, Twitter, and all the other social media communications which make it better than it ever has been. The Personnel Board will retain the power and authority to supervise and to make sure there are no inappropriate activities. The rehire list is a problem, right now, in the Personnel Board, you can be on the rehire list for any position opened. In the bill, your name will be placed on the rehire list under the same classified position you left. If you were a nurse, you will be on the nurse rehire list; if you were a dump truck driver, you will be on the dump truck driver rehire list. We get so many people who aren't qualified for positions, but we have to spend due process in talking with them just because they're on the rehire list which doesn't make it very efficient. The layoff list will not be last in first out; it will be the recommendation of the appointing authorities based on the needs of the agency. The Personnel Board will have the ultimate authority to approve the layoff list, and if necessary, they could hold a hearing for an appointing authority to justify, for example, why they are keeping a person who is younger, which could be for their computer skills. In our case, the person could be a Disease Control Expert on viral infections; that would be very important for us to retain that person versus somebody else if we were dealing with the Zika Virus. The use it or lose it component of leave. We think that people earn their leave, and if they stay working with us for a long time, health care or poor health, doesn't take holidays, we will work out an opportunity with the employee. If we needed them to work, they earned their leave; we will be able to

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compensate them using the Personnel Board's formula that exists right now when they retire for their uncompensated leave, but right now you can only keep a certain amount of leave on the books, so you use it or lose it. Some people are perfectly happy. I've got one physician who has been with me over twenty-five (25) years in the agency. He earns a tremendous amount of leave, and I expect him not to give it up, but I would love to have the opportunity to pay him for another week of service in seeing patients instead of being at home. He would be willing to do it; he has plenty of time. Those are the four (4) basic changes we are encouraging, and the Mobile County Personnel Board does not give up any dollars, they'll get the same dollar amount they have, and they give up no authority or supervision. We have to run government like a business; we need to be as efficient as we can. We hired two hundred twenty-seven (227) persons off of different classification lists in the past four (4) years. The longest wait was one hundred seventy-two (172) days, and that is a long time. We had trouble finding a Chief Financial Officer for our organization. We would like to advertise for nursing positions in certain places like the health care journals to target what we are looking for in talents and skills. Commissioner Ludgood, I deeply appreciate the idea of having proper oversight. The average time has been fifty-two (52) days from the time we look for somebody; fifty-two (52) days is a long time to fill a position. We look forward to making changes in our community. It's a pleasure to be the Health Officer and to work with everybody and to be proactive on many issues including the plumbing inspections.

Commissioner Ludgood: We might be better served by having a study group look at the Personnel Board and our range of issues. For example, we often amend, we have special dispensations; a study group could step back from the 1939 Act and then look at it comprehensively rather than doing it piecemeal. I will admit some things need to be fixed; I use to represent the Personnel Board in my other life, so I know some places are murky, ambiguous, and hard to manage. Everybody is going to be affected by these changes, but if you have a study group, you would have the opportunity for employee input and employer input. When we walk away with the list of things we need to change, then you would have already tried to make the various Acts comfortable going forth at a level that the monitoring needed is in place so we won't have these fears from employees of what this is going to mean for them. That to me makes more sense. Every few years we have somebody who has popped up with one of these bills to change the Personnel Board, and the Personnel Board is changing. There is concern in the community that we could

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end up with no minority representation on the Personnel Board. Those are the kinds of things people care about, and we need to make sure we are building support for this from the ground up as opposed to this feeling like it's being pushed down.

Dr. Eichold: This is the second year this has been introduced. One year we tried to get community input, but we learned we have to crawl before we walk, and this is a crawl change that can go into place. I agree on a comprehensive study, but I have been around the sun almost as many times in government as many people are in this room, and if we try to bite off too much, we get nowhere. We're looking to keep the oversight with the system that we have in place because that is what people trust and understand. These four (4) changes to the Personnel Board are not major changes like buying back people's vacation time. Some appointing authorities may not have any money to buy individuals' vacation time, and we will have to work out the procedure, so it's fair with the Personnel Board. Everything that's included keeps the Personnel Board as the ultimate authority and the system in place, it just gives us an opportunity to try to move forward. Small jurisdictions may not have enough people in their Human Resource Department as your fear is, but I promise you, we just need to make sure there is a watchdog group. The Personnel Board will call the appointing authority; one time Marvin Richardson called me and said he needed me to come over because he had heard about something we were doing. I had to go and spend time with Marvin, and that was many years ago. We usually don't have many problems with the Personnel Board, and I respect each and every one of them. We try to abide by the rules and treat people fairly. Our record is pretty good with the Personnel Board. Thank you for the opportunity, I agree with you, but if we try to take too many changes at one time to study it, we will be another forty (40) years down the road still studying it.

Commissioner Ludgood: You can study, then change incrementally.

Dr. Eichold: Right.

Commissioner Ludgood: What's happening now, you are not able to get anywhere because of the people's fears. If this is going to move, you will have to create an opportunity for people to feel like their concerns are heard and are reflected in what you bring. It doesn't do you any good, in my judgment, to keep introducing it then can't even get out of the local delegation.

Dr. Eichold: I agree, and I think there is misinformation causing the people to have fear out there. The true overline situation is that the Personnel Board does not lose any authority as far as oversight of the

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system and that's been going on for seventy (70) years. People have a lot of history with it, and we've got good Personnel Board members. Thank you for the opportunity, and if the timing is not right we understand, but it's like treating an illness, we have got to keep pushing until we have a better outcome.

Mayor Annette Johnson, City of Bayou La Batre, Alabama: I want to encourage y'all as you move forward in reviewing this situation that we take this matter very seriously. In our city, we had an incident of a Public Service Worker I (PSW I), who worked on the garbage truck was laid-off. We have a long-term employee who also is a Public Service Worker I (PSW I), who cannot function in that capacity, but because of his longevity he had a higher ranking and was not removed. This is my personal situation I have told y'all to encourage y'all to think wisely as you review the documents that are before you.
