

May 23, 2016

MOBILE COUNTY COMMISSION

The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Government Plaza Multi-Purpose Room, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, May 23, 2016, at 10:00 A. M. The following members of the Commission were present: Jerry L. Carl, President, Merceria Ludgood and Connie Hudson, Members. Also present were John F. Pafenbach, County Administrator/Clerk of the Commission, Jay Ross, County Attorney, and Joe W. Ruffer, County Engineer. President Carl chaired the meeting.

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INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Reverend Chester Battles, Associate Minister, Lily Baptist Church, 358 Kennedy Street, Mobile, Alabama.

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**Reverend Nathaniel Wilder, newly appointed Pastor of the Little Rock African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Zion Church, 10010 Fernland Road, Grand Bay, Alabama:** My members' biggest complaint is road pavement in the Fernland Community. We have a list of roads in our area we would like for you to consider paving.

**Commission President Jerry L. Carl:** We are in the process of putting together a list, and I will take your list under advisement. I only have a certain amount of money to work with, but I will certainly review your list and give it a good sharp eye.

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**Julie Bellcase, AltaPointe Health Systems:** We have a request on the Agenda, Item #28, that we would like the Commission to pass. It is a resolution amending AltaPointe's Certificate of Formation to allow AltaPointe to merge with the Cheaha Regional Mental Health Center that serves Clay, Coosa, Randolph and Talladega Counties, Alabama. Our corporate headquarters will remain in Mobile, and all officers of the corporation will be the original AltaPointe Board of Directors. To give you a little background, community mental health centers across the country are merging to create economies of scale in times of diminishing public support. In the past few years, AltaPointe has experienced declining revenue at the federal, the state, the city and the county levels, and also cigarette tax revenue. We acquired Baldwin County Mental Health Center two (2) years ago in a similar type

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merger. It has been tremendously successful, certainly for Baldwin County, but also for Mobile County because we are able to spread our administrative overhead cost over a larger provider base. There will be no impact on services provided in Mobile County because of the merger. This is simply to use basic business principles to create greater efficiencies and less dependence on public funds.

**Commission President Jerry L. Carl:** AltaPointe is it a corporation or is it a government entity?

**Ms. Bellcase:** We are a 310 Board, a public nonprofit corporation incorporated under Act 310 of 1967. The 310 Boards were created to plan and provide services to the mentally ill, the intellectually and developmentally disabled and those with a substance use disorder.

**Commissioner Merceria Ludgood:** When you merged with Baldwin County Mental Health Center, it was contiguous, and I could see the economies of scale, but this seems a little bit more remote.

**Ms. Bellcase:** Cheaha Regional Mental Health Center approached us to merge which is something that is going on across the country where smaller mental health centers are seeking out larger mental health centers for their infrastructure. They are small and cannot do electronic health records. It is so easy for us with modern technology from our base in Mobile to help manage their electronic health records. The clinical leadership at Cheaha Regional Mental Health Center will be as it is now.

**Commissioner Ludgood:** Basically, AltaPointe would do the administrative work, but will not draw from our clinical resources to serve.

**Ms. Bellcase:** That is exactly right, Commissioner.

**Commissioner Connie Hudson:** Do you anticipate further mergers?

**Ms. Bellcase:** We do not have anyone in the queue, but we could be approached after today.

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**District Attorney Ashley Rich:** I will speak about the soccer complex, Agenda Item #17, on behalf of all County employees including the men and women of Mobile County District Attorney's Office who also are County employees, and on behalf of Victims of Crime in Mobile County. The Alabama Supreme Court ruled that a very significant amount of additional funding is to be paid to the Mobile County District Attorney's Office. It is not smart, and frankly, it is bad business, to borrow money for a soccer complex

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when you are required to pay additional money to the Mobile County District Attorney's Office. Can you give all County employees and Victims of Crime a promise and assure them before you vote yes on funding the soccer complex, that you can pay what you owe to the Mobile County District Attorney's Office and the loan without cutting the funding to other County offices and without making County employees suffer? If you cannot make that promise and assurance, then please, do the responsible thing and vote against the proposal for funding the soccer complex.

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**Richard Cayton, President, Mobile County Merit System Employees Association:** You said you heard us loud and clear almost two (2) years ago, but you still have not taken any action. Two (2) years ago, we provided you with the names of fifteen (15) cities and counties throughout Mobile County and the State of Alabama, along with the cost of insurance for their employees. Mobile County has one of the worst insurance plans for their employees and retirees. If the County got on equal footing with these municipalities and counties, you would have more people eligible to retire which would allow the County to hire new employees at a lower salary. No one can afford to retire and pay the high cost of insurance, it needs to be lowered at least by half. The salaries of most Mobile County employees do not meet the standard of many counties in the State of Alabama. For example, employees of Mobile County Sheriff's Office including Corrections Officers are some of the lowest paid in the United States. We have been asking for two (2) years that the County Commission bring us up to nationwide standards. Instead, the County Commission has become detached from its employees. Your actions need to show good faith towards employees. Employees have sacrificed for many years with little to show. The members of the Mobile County Merit System Employees Association oppose any project that requires the County to borrow money to fund it. Mobile County needs an open line of communication with the Commissioners and employees so we can work together to solve our problems. We should be supporting each other rather than working against each other. We request a meeting with the County Commissioners to present our findings of the differences in pay within the State of Alabama and how Mobile County is losing money because of it. Remember, employees are a reflection of you, take care of us, and we will take care of you.

**Commission President Jerry L. Carl:** Richard, will you put some structure together on those numbers and bring them to me?

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**Mr. Cayton:** We have them already and will get them to you next week.

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**Clair Wilson, Dog River Clear Water Revival:** I have concerns about the soccer complex, Agenda Item #17. I am a representative of Dog River Clear Water Revival, a local nonprofit organization that is working to improve and protect the water quality of Dog River and its tributaries. I am a resident of Moore Creek where the water will drain into from the soccer complex. A year or more ago, representatives from our group met with representatives of the County to discuss the project and at that time the plans were not done, but assurances were made that the project would not impact the water quality of Dog River and its tributaries. We are very concerned after watching the effects of the runoff at the McGowin Park Project and other such projects, and more importantly, after an independent environmental consultant has told us, the water quality in terms of erosion and sediment would affect Dog River and its tributaries. We are not against soccer. We love soccer. My son is going to do club soccer, so I get it. Our organization would like assurances that the effects of the project would not be detrimental to Dog River and its tributaries, and if the project goes through, the plans will be changed to reflect our concerns.

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**Angela Rangel, Environmental Consultant and Biologist:** We are not against a soccer complex, Agenda Item #17. I would rather it be a soccer complex than anything else, but there are concerns. It is 947 feet of perennial stream and 5.9 acres of wetlands that would be filled, 1,000 feet stream in an area where there is a lack of. There is hardly any wetlands or streams remaining in the area north of Interstate 10 (I-10) that would not be affected. You should take that into consideration and design the project so it would not hit so much of wetlands or the stream, at least reduce the impact. The impact will not be mitigated on Dog River so the loss would be substantial and affect Dog River's water quality. The mitigation would occur south of Laurendine Road, and it would only benefit Deer River. Anything that runs down the stream or through those wetlands' drainages from the soccer field would go into the tributaries of Moore Creek where manatee have been found. Manatees are on the endangered species list, they feed on the grass, the plants around it and the stream. Y'all need to take into account the impact of the runoff site and make sure it is designed appropriately. Do you really need two (2) soccer fields in the wetlands? There are ten (10)

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currently designed soccer fields, can you do with eight (8) and redesign the adjacent water park and everything else accordingly?

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**Danny Corte, Executive Director, Mobile Sports**

**Authority:** When the Mobile County Commission created the Mobile Sports Authority in 2009, you charged us with the mission of being the main advocate of sports tourism for the entire County, a mission we did not take lightly then or do now. In the past seven (7) years, we are proud to have attracted, hosted and/or supported one hundred twenty-five (125) sporting events which have generated an estimated \$80 million economic impact to Mobile County which included a record year this past year. I hope we met your expectations over these past seven (7) years, but even with those numbers we could become a greater sports tourism destination which translates into more income for our area, we just lack a few sports facilities that would get us there. The discussion about the potential County athletic complex on the Agenda today and as the charged advocate of sports tourism in our County, I want to address the issues concerning the need for such a venue and are we late to the soccer party? Well, simply speaking, we are not late to the party. Unlike most of our competitors, Mobile County already has the supporting infrastructure in place which is needed for this type of athletic complex to succeed. When compared to other nearby communities, our supporting infrastructure includes many more affordable hotel rooms, more diverse restaurants, more retailers, an excellent interstate system that would help move our future visitors around more efficiently, and even a World War II Battleship for our visitors to see. Not many places we compete against have all that. We already have the surrounding mechanism in place to achieve the maximum economic return we all want from new sporting events and new sporting venues. Whatever decision is made by this body as we have for the past seven (7) years, the Mobile Sports Authority will continue our mission of attracting, managing, supporting those potential sporting events which would showcase our beautiful County as we attract those visitors to our community. Thank you for your time and as always your continued support.

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**Dr. Barry A. Vittor, President, Biological and Environmental Scientist, Barry A. Vittor & Associates, Inc.:**

I have been doing environmental studies similar to the soccer complex in Mobile, Alabama for about forty (40) years. My company handled the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers permitting process on behalf of the County with Neel-Schaeffer, Inc. The site plan approved by the U. S.

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Army Corps of Engineers shows a number of features which are unique to the project compared to the commercial development of McGowin Park Project. For example, the parking area is intended to have permeable pavement layers of sand and soil to allow quick collection of rainfall which reduces the amount of runoff going downstream into retention ponds. This kind of amenity is associated with the provisions of strong order management compliance with all state requirements. The water quality will not be affected by this project. For example, the baseball stadium is entirely permeable pavers and has not diminished the water quality in Dog River that also flows downstream into Moore Creek. There are substantial retention ponds that are provided at the baseball stadium to accommodate the runoff. We have gone through at least five (5) iterations of designs intended to minimize the impact on wetlands and the stream. It is important to note, if the soccer complex is not built at this location, you probably will see a commercial development which will be disinclined to preserve over 80 acres of wetlands on this property. The soccer project would maintain those wetlands where they would continue to absorb the rainfall runoff. The manatees are at the bottom of Morris Creek, and are welcomed to show up and feed, they have not been affected by McGowin Park Project.

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**Chad Harrelson, Executive Director, Mobile United Futbol Club:** In 2015, to justify putting turf fields at Sage Park, Mayor Sandy Stimpson said, "because the fields at Sage Park are in constant use, it is nearly impossible for grass to grow and the result is, that they are in deplorable condition for most of the year." I do not want to contradict my good friend, Mr. Corte, but we are late to the party, very late. The party is growing, and we are going to miss it if we do not do something about it. The County Commission and the City of Mobile have put almost \$3 million toward improvements at Sage Park. We had a net gain of one (1) field because there already were two (2) fields and now we have three (3) good fields. We share those fields with three (3) soccer clubs, lacrosse, flag football, kickball, semi-pro football and pretty much anybody else who wants to be out there. The improvements at Sage Park were needed, we are grateful and thankful for what y'all did, but it was only a bandaid, a very small one for a very big problem. Mayor Stimpson also said in 2015, "if we can improve the experience our children have in our parks, we'll have more robust recreation programs, we'll get more children off of the streets and we'll become a safer and more family friendly City." Here is a quote from Oscar Wilde, "a cynic is someone who knows the cost of everything and the value of nothing." I would like to ask you, what is the value of ten, twenty or one hundred kids that stay off the streets and out of our legal system

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because we provided them with amenities to become better citizens. What is the value of fifty, one hundred, two hundred, three hundred families that decide to stay in Mobile and pay their tax dollars living in Mobile as opposed to Baldwin County because we were willing to provide the things that their families needed, and their children wanted? What is the value of knowing that you were one of the few visionaries in our political system that could look back over your career and say look at what we were able to achieve instead of saying look at what I was able to stop us from achieving?

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**Mobile City Councilmember Bess Rich:** I would like to acknowledge the presence of Mobile City Councilmember Fredrick D. Richardson, Jr. The Mobile City Council shows its support for this very vital project by authorizing the transfer of \$1.5 million from the City's Parks and Recreation allocation towards this soccer sports complex initiative. The County has a long and admirable history of enhancing the City of Mobile's recreation by supporting the City's recreation venues, such as improvements at Sage Park, Trimmier Park, Medal of Honor Park and the Connie Hudson Mobile Regional Senior Community Center, just to name a few. We are forever grateful for your participation. The Connie Hudson Mobile Regional Senior Community Center with its 9,000 members would not have been built without the County's \$1 million toward its initiative. Additionally, Commissioner Hudson was a City Councilmember at the time who helped to secure a bond issue and also a way to pay down the note which was through the Alabama Trust Fund. Similarly, and hopefully, the County has identified a way to pay the capital requirements for the soccer fields and sports complex through the growth of lodging taxes. There is no need for a tax increase with this mechanism and certainly no need for money to be taken out of the County's operations. No one should question Mobile's pent up need for this complex even smaller cities than our size has had the foresight to build these complexes for their citizens. I am sure Daphne, Alabama; Gulfport, Mississippi; Foley, Alabama; and Pensacola, Florida are kind of hoping that Mobile will not build this amenity. Since those cities have greatly benefited by our economic oversight. They have achieved the goal of our adults and children traveling to them to play in soccer tournaments. Last week, Alabama.com reported our 2015 city census to be stagnant or actually decreasing, compared to other cities in our state. Obviously, there are many reasons why a city will not grow. As you know, citizens considering moving to our city or any community, judge the quality and quantity of the recreation venues available as criteria for selecting a city to raise their families. By approving this soccer sports complex, the County will send a very positive message to prospective homebuyers, but more

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importantly, to our citizens that our area is family friendly, and we value recreation. I along with the supermajority of my Council colleagues see the soccer sports complex initiative as a much needed quality of life enhancement for our community and a positive step forward. Please allow it to happen.

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**Noah Trey Oliver, III, Warden, Metro Jail:** Mobile City Councilmember Bess Rich invoked Daphne, Alabama; Gulfport, Mississippi; Foley, Alabama; and Pensacola, Florida, but she needs to look at the pay scales between those agencies and our agencies. All of those agencies pay their employees more than what you all pay your employees. The leaders of those cities and counties had the foresight to jump on the soccer wagon years ago, when it was hot. This is too much, and it is too late. Are we doing it for the children of our area or are we doing it for tourism? If it is for tourism; why are we bringing them to an obscure part of town that does not have interstate access, does not have local motels and is in an industrial area possibly facing an environmental impact? Where are the private partners? We are not against soccer. I have grandchildren that play soccer every weekend, I have to drive on a dirt road and park in a dirt parking lot to watch them play. Is this for the local children or is it for tourism? If it is for tourism, surely we can find cheaper land. There is a reason why this land has not sold until now because it is out in the middle of nowhere and does not have easy access. Why does the County have to share the lion's share of this project? Where are the private partners? What are you doing as County Commissioners to help us recruit and retain quality County employees? You have approximately sixteen hundred (1,600) employees you are responsible for, what are you doing for them? We are not feeling the love, we are not feeling the communication. If you all are leaders, then set an example. Let us start a dialogue, the three (3) of you and the County employees. It is sickening and embarrassing to hear County employees say certain Commissioners won't even speak to them or acknowledge them in public. This is not personal. This is politics with you all, but with our people, it is their livelihood, that is why they are here, and this is only a small representation of the sixteen hundred (1,600) people who are citizens first and County employees second. Earlier someone invoked \$80 million in revenue for sports tourism, if you all experienced a record year then we are looking forward to pay raises this year, right? This is not a silver bullet, people are not going to decide to stay in Mobile just because of the soccer complex, there are a number of other items.

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**Ruben Risco, Mobile United Futbol Club (FC):** I am an humble citizen as a representative of Mobile United Futbol Club (FC). This has been a very enlightened and educational experience. I respect the opinions of both, those for and against the soccer complex. I am the newly appointed Director of Coaching (DOC) the soccer club at the Mobile United Futbol Club (FC) as of January 2016. I was born and raised in our great city, Mobile. My parents legally migrated from Peru to have more opportunities for themselves and their future children. I started playing soccer as a child at Sage Park Youth Soccer League in the 1980s. I went on to play high school ball at McGill-Toolen Catholic High School and finished my collegiate soccer career at the University of Mobile where I earned my Master's in Education. I returned to McGill-Toolen Catholic High School, my Alma Mater, and headed the Boys Soccer Program. I recently finished the Educational Leadership Program for School Administration at the University of West Florida (UWF). Soccer has been and is a part of my life that has tied me to Mobile. During my formable years, I played competitive soccer in Mobile and clubs in the Birmingham area. I traveled all over the southeast playing in tournaments, league games, and special events. I have many fun memories of those years traveling with my parents, friends, and teammates to different venues. As a child and a teenager, I never thought too much about the soccer complex we played at or the cities, big or small, that hosted those events. As I reflect on those years, there is a city that does not make the list our city, Mobile, because we have no true soccer complex. Now as an educated adult and a citizen of Mobile, I realize the economic, culture and social impact those soccer complexes had and have in local communities, cities, and states. More specifically, as it pertains to my position as a Director of Coaching (DOC), there is an absolute need to have a soccer complex, it is paramount for the continued development of the sport within the community. The club has grown to six hundred (600) plus players and counting. We are lacking facility space for practices, hosting games, and needed and wanted programs. Our mission of inclusivity is to find and to develop an environment that matches our players' abilities, and through their desire, we have seen the club grow. Congruently, both the club's reputation and the sport's popularity will only continue to attract more players. Commissioners, we need your help, your partnership, and your forward thinking vision. The club soccer community, the City, and the County need this soccer complex. The dream of building it must now be made into a reality, or we completely put ourselves in a long standing losing position, perhaps permanently. We are already lagging behind our Baldwin County neighbors and their soccer complexes; Daphne, Fairhope, Foley, Gulf Shores,

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Orange Beach and Perdido. Not to mention our Mississippi neighbors; Pascagoula, Gautier, and Gulfport. Please do not let any more time pass by or risk having nothing while our neighbors bask in having everything needed for soccer success.
