MOBILE COUNTY COMMISSION

The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Government Plaza Auditorium, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, March 10, 2014, at 10:00 A. M. The following members of the Commission were present: Merceria Ludgood, President, Connie Hudson and Jerry L. Carl, Members. Also present were John F. Pafenbach, County Administrator/Clerk of the Commission, Jay Ross, County Attorney, and Joe W. Ruffer, County Engineer. President Ludgood chaired the meeting.

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INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Reverend Charlotte Greene, Itinerate Elder/Youth Minister, Bethel AME Church, Mobile, Alabama.

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**The following is a synopsis of the comments made:**

Angela Renard, Intervention and Prevention for Today's Youth Inc. (IPPY), addressed the Commission and said a dream was coming to fruition. She said the name of that dream is Intervention and Prevention for Today's Youth, and IPPY is its acronym. Ms. Renard said Intervention and Prevention for Today's Youth (IPPY) was created to work with communities, juveniles and hopefully with the James T. Strickland Youth Center, to present guidance in a holistic manner of how to live. She said in the counseling field they do a wrap around treatment where all entities work together. Ms. Renard said Intervention and Prevention for Today's Youth (IPPY) is designed to work with individuals assigned by the Juvenile Court for that kind of guidance. She said she met with Circuit Judge Edmond G. Naman and Chief Probation Officer Lawrence Battiste at the James T. Strickland Youth Center and they gave her the go ahead to become a partner with them. Ms. Renard said they told her about a second trailer on the property she could use as a facility for intakes and assessments of individuals who are assigned to her counseling program by the Juvenile Court. She said Intervention and Prevention for Today's Youth (IPPY) Inc. was a point five (.5) treatment facility which means it provides an intensive outpatient treatment that is governed by the guidelines of the Department of Mental Health. Ms. Renard said they were excited to have a partnership with the James T. Strickland Youth Center. She said today she stands before the Commission to request their permission to move forward in the partnership with the James T. Strickland Youth Center.

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President Ludgood said Judge Naman makes the decisions on the providers he will contract with for services at the James T. Strickland Center. She said the County Commission only processes the information given to them by him.

Ms. Renard said Judge Naman gave her permission to be a provider in December, 2013.

Geoffrey Tynan of the James T. Strickland Center said Judge Naman was currently reviewing the proposal.

President Ludgood said the Commission would wait for Judge Naman to send them the paperwork.

Ms. Renard said okay.

Commissioner Carl said positive services were desperately needed for those kids and he thanked Ms. Renard for her efforts.

Ms. Renard said it was her pleasure.

Commissioner Carl said when the whole community gets involved it would start fixing itself.

Ms. Renard said if she did not get paid to be a counselor that would be fine because it was not about the money it was about the community, it was about the children, it was about making a difference in their lives and passing it along.

Commissioner Hudson thanked Ms. Renard and said they appreciate the information she has shared with them.

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**The following is a synopsis of the comments made:**

Casi Callaway, Executive Director, Mobile Baykeeper, addressed the Commission and said Mobile Baykeeper filed a lawsuit to challenge the permit that was issued by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers for Plains Southcap, L.L.C. crude oil pipeline. She said the crude oil pipeline project was permitted without proper environmental review or consideration of the pipeline's close proximity to Mobile's drinking water supply.

Ms. Callaway said in August, 2013, the County had agreed with that statement. She said Commissioner Carl expressed his outrage to the media over the federal permit and Commissioner Hudson told the media there were too many gaps in the process. Ms. Callaway said the Commissioners were so alarmed they had an attorney write a letter, including with it a very thick binder, to the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers which demanded the permit to be revoked. She said Mobile Baykeeper at that time applauded the

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Commissioners for their efforts, but unfortunately, that was where it stopped. Ms. Callaway said the Commissioners penned a letter last month retracting their statement saying everything was fine. She asked what information has been provided to the Commissioners that have caused them to change their opinion about it. Ms. Callaway said in August, 2013, Commissioner Hudson said on record "There is too much at stake here in terms of protecting our drinking water." She said on behalf of two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) citizens who drink the water in Mobile, Alabama and thousands of businesses that rely on a clean source of water, we need to understand why the Commissioners were no longer standing strong to protect Mobile's drinking water, if that was the case. Ms. Callaway said the pumping of millions of gallons of crude oil everyday so close to Mobile's drinking water puts constituents at severe risk and recent events in the states of West Virginia and North Carolina have proved it. She said putting private profits before public health and public protection does not pay. Ms. Callaway said look at the cost of the ongoing oil cleanup from the spill at the Kalamazoo River Project. She said they have spent over \$1 million and still have at least one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons to clean up. Ms. Callaway asked the Commissioners why did they change their minds and why did they change their opinion? She said the residents of Mobile County depend on them as their leaders to be strong on this issue.

Commissioner Hudson said it was not a matter of them changing their minds or changing their opinion. She said they were as committed as ever to protect Mobile's drinking water. Commissioner Hudson said Mobile Area Water & Sewer System (MAWSS), which the Commission supported had the only legal standing to move forward. She said the Commission hired an attorney to work on the legal aspect of the issue and spent upwards of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) to support Mobile Area Water & Sewer System's (MAWSS) position. Commissioner Hudson said they were still moving forward to get the laws changed to provide better notification which would help them protect Mobile's drinking water.

Ms. Callaway said she understands why the Commission did not support Mobile Baykeeper's lawsuit against the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, that was not the question she asked. She said the question she asked was why did the Commissioners retract their position about the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers permit? Ms. Callaway said the fact still remains that they were granted Nationwide Permits which require no public notice, no public opinion and was only to be used in cases of small infractions, small wetlands impact, but not the drinking water intake as the document the Commission paid fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) proves and is pointed out in the Commission's letter written about a month ago.

Commissioner Hudson said the letter stated that the Commission recognized the fact the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers followed their guidelines.

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Ms. Callaway said the research the Commission's attorney did was very clear and specific in the opposite direction. She asked if they had new information and if they have proof that the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers followed their guidelines, she would love to see it.

Commissioner Hudson said the Attorney was absent from the meeting today, but she would be glad to sit down with Ms. Callaway to discuss this matter in depth. She said the legal recommendation to the Commission was that the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers followed their guidelines and the Commission has done all it can do in this arena at this time.
