The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Government Plaza Auditorium, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, January 27, 2014, at 10:00 A. M. PRESENT RESOLUTION OF COMMENDATION
FOR PROFESSIONAL ACHIEVEMENT/SANDRA FORBUS

The following is a synopsis of the comments made:

Commissioner Hudson presented a resolution of commendation for professional achievement to Sandra Forbus, who has served as Executive Director of Mobile United for thirteen (13) years, and will now retire after devoting nearly two (2) decades of her life to public service. She said the Commission is commending Ms. Forbus for her outstanding dedication, leadership and commitment to Mobile County. Commissioner Hudson said during her tenure, Ms. Forbus has been the driving force behind the development and promotion of several programs to improve the quality of life in Mobile County. She said Mobile County has achieved significant milestones under Ms. Forbus' leadership, and among her noteworthy accomplishments were the Healthy Teen Network, which provides training on programs targeting teen pregnancy; a Sea Grass insert card which is included with boat license renewals to promote the protection of sea grasses; a Hurricane Preparedness Guide translated into four (4) languages and distributed throughout Mobile County; the Eating Healthy Food Guide and Exercising as a Family brochure distributed within the City of Mobile; Young and Mobile to target childhood obesity; Live Better Mobile to connect our community with health and wellness providers in an effort to achieve healthy weight, prevent teen pregnancy and quit tobacco. Commissioner Hudson said Ms. Forbus has earned the respect and gratitude of her colleagues, state and local leaders, as well as, the public at large, for her willingness to help others and her adherence to the highest standards of ethical conduct; and for her steadfast devotion to the betterment of Mobile County.

The Commission commends Ms. Forbus on her extraordinary professional achievement on the occasion of her retirement as Executive Director of Mobile United and by a copy of this resolution we convey our highest esteem and further extend our heartfelt best wishes to her for good health, happiness and blessings for years to come.

Ms. Forbus thanked the Commissioners and said she could not have done it without their help. She introduced Katherine Pitman, Mobile United new Executive Director, and Chris Barraza, who will take the reins of Youth Leadership Mobile, Inc.

The following is a synopsis of the comments made:

Marty O'Malley, Executive Director, L'Arche Mobile, addressed the Commission and said the Servis 1st Bank First Light Marathon event had the participation of approximately twenty-seven hundred (2,700) runners, and 46 percent of them were from outside of Mobile County and Baldwin County areas. He said approximately nine hundred (900) hotel rooms were booked during the weekend of the event. Mr. O'Malley said approximately four hundred (400) runners ran a full marathon or a half marathon in Jackson, Mississippi, and the next day those same runners ran a full or half marathon in Mobile, Alabama. He said the number of psychiatrists was increased at the finish line for those runners. Mr. O'Malley said six (6) countries were represented in the marathon, forty-nine (49) states plus a representative from Washington, D.C.; he said Wyoming was the only state that did not participate, but next year he plans to have all fifty (50) states. Mr. O'Malley said the marathon event would not have been successful without the support of over seven hundred (700) volunteer workers. He presented a special award to Commissioner Hudson for her participation as a runner in the 1.2 mile run.

Commissioner Hudson thanked Mr. O'Malley and said it was a beautiful day with a great turnout. She said she had the utmost respect and awe for marathon runners.

The following is a synopsis of the comments made:

John Pafenbach, County Administrator, said a presentation on the study done by the University of Florida, the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) and the National Animal Control Association (NACA) was to immediately follow the meeting today and also an Indigent Care Board meeting was scheduled to follow, too.

President Ludgood said they will recess the meeting, hold the Indigent Care Board meeting and then adjourn from the presentation. She asked Joe Ruffer, County Engineer, did he want to talk about the weather now or wait until after the meeting?

Mr. Ruffer said a meeting was scheduled for an update on the weather today at 11:30 A. M. which would provide him with more information, but he has kept himself updated during the last couple of days through the National Weather Service. He said his supervisory staff met during the weekend and discussed what they could do if ice covered the bridges and roads. Mr. Ruffer said Commissioner Jerry L. Carl, District 3, called him during the weekend and asked what preparations were being made for the bridges and roads

if they became icy. He said Mobile County does not have the equipment to remove snow or ice, so they rented fertilizer bunks and will attach them to dump trucks to spread sand onto the bridges and roads if they become icy. Mr. Ruffer said he has on standby two (2) major asphalt producers in case the sand needs to be dried. He said they will spread sand on the bridges, arterial and collector roads starting late in the afternoon. Mr. Ruffer said they were pretty much prepared for the weather, but he welcomes any recommendations.

President Ludgood asked Mr. Ruffer, did he need emergency authority for contracting or purchasing?

Mr. Ruffer said no. He said it was possible that the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) had an excess of road salt, but it had not been confirmed. He said below freezing weather was a significant event and he recommended the Commission to consider closing the Government Plaza tomorrow. He said Mobile County would experience a minimum of fifty (50) hours below freezing weather starting at 5:00 A. M., which would cause an accumulation of sleet and ice on the bridges and roads making it dangerous for motorists to travel.

Commissioner Hudson asked Mr. Ruffer, if they would close the bridges?

Mr. Ruffer said they would leave the bridges open, but motorists must be cautious and drive very carefully, especially during nighttime because the ice becomes invisible appearing on the road in complete blackness which is referred to as 'black ice' and very hard to see.

Commissioner Hudson asked what about power outages?

Mr. Ruffer said if power outages occurred, the loss of heat would cause pipes that lack proper insulation to burst.

Commissioner Hudson told Mr. Ruffer to update the Commission on the weather and any recommendations after his 11:30 A. M. meeting with the Emergency Management Agency (EMA).

The County Commission reconvened in its regular meeting in the Government Plaza Multi-Purpose Room, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, January 27, 2014, at approximately 10:50 A. M.

PRESENTATION/UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA, HUMANE
SOCIETY OF THE UNITED STATES AND NATIONAL ANIMAL
CONTROL ASSOCIATION/STUDY OF MOBILE COUNTY ANIMAL SHELTER

The following is a synopsis of the comments made:

Donna Jones, General Services Director, said the University of Florida, the Humane Society of the United States and the National Animal Control Association, did an in-depth study of the Mobile County Animal Shelter and its field operations. She acknowledged and welcomed Mobile County Animal Shelter staff: Carmelo Miranda, County Humane Officer; Andrew Stubbs, Resource Supervisor; Kathy Belcher, Office Manager; and members of the advisory board. Ms. Jones said members of the consultation teams would present their study and best practices recommendations through a pre-recorded audio cassette and presentation slides.

Dr. Cynda Crawford, Faculty Member, Maddie's Shelter Medicine Program at the University of Florida, College of Veterinary Medicine, said the presentation's focus was to introduce some recommendations that have high impact value for increasing the shelter's lifesaving capacity, high impact value for increasing performance efficiency of field services in the community and the required support needed from the County Commissioners. She said their consultation goal was to implement industry best practices to enhance the shelter's ability to achieve its mission for the community, especially in the areas of protection of public safety, animal nuisance abatement, protection against animal cruelty and providing homeless animals with positive outcomes. Dr. Crawford said their study covered the period September 30, 2013 through October 4, 2013. She said the veterinarians' consultation team studied best practices that would enhance the health and welfare of shelter animals.

Dr. Crawford said the consultation team at the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) studied best practices that would increase shelter animals live outcomes through adoption programs. She said the consultation team at the National Animal Control Association (NACA) studied best practices for field services. Dr. Crawford thanked the County Commission, the members of the advisory board for the Mobile County Animal Shelter and the staff members at the Mobile County Animal Shelter for embracing and implementing the recommendations of the consultation teams. She said the Mobile County Animal Shelter's 2012 Performance Metrics showed that seven thousand thirty-seven (7,037)

animals were admitted to the animal shelter. Dr. Crawford said they were mostly stray dogs and cats with half of them being puppies and kittens which were significant because puppies and kittens were desirable for adoption, but were most vulnerable to life threatening diseases that circulate in animal shelters. She said the live release outcome rate was 39 percent, five (5) out of every ten (10) dogs and one (1) out of every ten (10) cats.

Dr. Crawford said dogs suffering with illnesses were euthanized, no Pit Bulls or Chow dogs over three (3) months old were allowed to be adopted, and 88 percent of the cats believed to be feral were euthanized.

Dr. Katherine Polak, Maddie's Shelter Medicine Program at the University of Florida, said the veterinarians' consultation team focused on making the Mobile County Animal Shelter a safer place for cats. She said their recommendations for lifesaving programs and policies were to develop programs for balancing cat admissions with live release outcomes; to remove mandatory 7-day hold periods for puppies and kittens; and to hire a shelter veterinarian to oversee physical and behavioral health of the shelter pets. Dr. Polak said most of the cats admitted were healthy strays or feral. She said 1 percent of stray cats were reclaimed by owners and 90 percent of stray and feral cats were euthanized. She said best practices to decrease euthanasia of healthy cats were to manage the intake to match capacity for care and live release outcomes. Polak recommended diverting healthy, stray or feral cats to neuter, vaccinate and return field programs (TNR); to admit stray cats with identification, sick or injured cats, cats that were legally confiscated and friendly kittens; and to admit owned pet cats on a space-available basis. She said the required resources were partnerships with local spay and neuter groups and a shelter staff person to help citizens access alternative care packages, spay and neuter, food bank and nuisance abatement. Dr. Polak said nearly half of all shelter admissions were puppies and kittens which were most adoptable. She said puppies and kittens were required to stay in the shelter for seven (7) days before being released; 1 percent were reclaimed by owners, 50 percent of puppies and 70 percent of kittens die from shelter-acquired disease. Dr. Polak recommended to eliminate the seven (7) day hold period allowing immediate animal adoption or transfer to rescue groups which reduces the risk of acquiring a life threatening disease in the shelter. She said the required resource was to change the County ordinance which would create a cost savings from decreased animal care days. Dr. Polak said proper medical management and health care for shelter animals was an absolute necessity. She said shelter programs must include veterinary supervision to provide evaluation, preventative care, diagnosis, and treatment. Dr. Polak recommended hiring a shelter veterinarian, she said the infrastructure was already in place.

Natalie DiGiacomo, Humane Society of the United States, said their consultant team focused on best practices to enhance and increase local adoptions. She said in 2013 the shelter registered as a contestant in the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) Rachel Ray \$100,000.00 Challenge for animal shelters across the country to come up with innovative ways to engage their communities and get more homeless cats and dogs into loving homes. Ms. DiGiacomo said in the area of adoptions the bright spots were the enthusiasm and willingness of the staff to try new things. She recommended expanding customer focus through positive photographs, convenient adoption hours, reaching out to the adopter, matchmaking, removing restrictions of landlord checks, Pit Bulls and Chow dogs. Ms. DiGiacoma said in the area of engaging the community through positive public relations, the bright spots were the common goals of the staff's commitment to transparency, self-assessment and self-improvement. She recommended the staff tell the shelter story everywhere in the field, online, in print, television and radio. Ms. DiGiacoma said in the area of investing in community expectations the bright spots were the staff's perseverance in the face of resource limitations, commitment to improve and the citizen support for improvements. She recommended to invest in resources that were in line with public expectations for lifesaving capacity and that support ordinances that would expedites live releases.

George Harding IV, Executive Director, National Animal Control Association (NACA), said their consultant team focused on best practices to streamline efficiency and increase productivity in field services. He said the Animal Control Officers use Chameleon Software that tracks field operations which helps the officers in the field and the employees in the animal shelter to observe field activities in real time. Mr. Harding recommended to cut the redundant activity of filling-out field reports by hand and then entering the same information into the Chameleon device. He said it was great that their vehicles have GPS locators, but the officers lack training in situational awareness. Mr. Harding recommended that all field officers be trained on how to protect themselves and to know when they should call for backup.
