MOBILE COUNTY COMMISSION

The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Government Plaza Auditorium, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, October 10, 2016, at 10:00 A. M. The following members of the Commission were present: Jerry L. Carl, President, Merceria Ludgood and Connie Hudson, Members. Also present were John F. Pafenbach, County Administrator/Clerk of the Commission, Jay Ross, County Attorney, and W. Bryan Kegley II, Assistant County Engineer. President Carl chaired the meeting.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Reverend Stephen Sohe, Priest, Saint Joseph Catholic Church, 1703 Dublin Street, Mobile, Alabama 36605.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl: Please remember in your thoughts and prayers: Richard A. Mitchell, our Deputy Public Works Director, his Father-in-law, Elmer Clifton Sullivan, is in intensive care in Birmingham, Alabama. Also, Phil Benson, our Treasurer, his wife's son passed away during the weekend in the City of Bogalusa, Louisiana.

PRESENT RESOLUTION/PROCLAIM OCTOBER AS
NATIONAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH/
MOBILE COUNTY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, domestic violence was a secret kept in families, but it is now recognized as a serious crime, that has severe consequences for the survivors, their children, their employers' and the community; and

WHEREAS, the problems of domestic violence are not confined to any group or groups of people, but cut across all economic, racial and societal barriers and are supported by societal differences; and

WHEREAS, the impact of domestic violence directly affects a wide range of individuals in society as a whole, in our community and communities throughout the United States and the world; and

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WHEREAS, almost 4 million women are physically abused by their husbands or boyfriends every year and to stop the cycle of this vicious crime requires not only the resolve and courage of survivors, but also the support and involvement of all of us; and

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Mobile County Commission does hereby proclaim the month of October as National Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and commend the efforts of the Mobile County Domestic Violence Task Force. We further urge all residents to actively participate in all scheduled activities and programs to work toward improving victims' safety and hold perpetrators of domestic abuse accountable for their actions against individual victims in our society as a whole.

Commissioner Connie Hudson: Tonie Anne does a great job, and we are very happy with her work and the impact it has on our community.

Tonie Anne Torrans, Executive Director, Penelope House: Penelope House is part of the Domestic Violence Task Force, the District Attorney's Office, Law Enforcement, those that are in social services. Not only the victims but also perpetrators are on the council. If anyone is interested, you can always contact the District Attorney's Office and be a part of it. Purple is the color of Domestic Violence Awareness, Peace on Earth begins at home.

Richard Cayton, Representative, Mobile County Merit System Employee's Association: Good morning, Commissioners. I am speaking on behalf of the Corrections Officers and the Deputy Sheriffs. The Mobile County Sheriff's Office has a problem with Deputy Sheriffs leaving; they are coming and going like a revolving door. This job requires us to have a license to practice law, doctors are required to have a license to practice medicine and nurses are required to have a license. We are a special group who are required to uphold the law, obey the law and enforce the law. Our pay is pretty bad; the national average for lowest paid is thirty-three thousand dollars (\$33,000.00), Mobile County Deputy Sheriffs are paid several thousand dollars less. The highest starting pay in the country for law enforcement is ninety-three thousand dollars (\$93,000.00). The highest-ranking person in the Sheriff's Office does not come close to that. Last year, forty-two (42) officers were killed in the line of duty. This year, October 2016, ninety-nine (99) officers were killed. The public's attitude has changed toward law

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enforcement, and our job is becoming more and more dangerous every day. There are over ninety thousand (90,000) municipalities in local government in the United States. The politicians are not being killed, it is the cops who are being killed because they are the frontline, but are not being paid for what they are worth. I would like for the Commissioners to take our pay under submission and study for two (2) weeks of what can be done to raise our pay to be normal, as the City of Mobile did for their police officers and firefighters.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl: Do y'all have any numbers compiled already to help us get started?

Mr. Cayton: We can get some numbers to you within a week or so.

Commission President Carl: I want a place to start, and I am sure Sheriff Sam Cochran and his staff can help generate some numbers as to what the County is paying now. Pardon me for using this as a term, but we have to make the County at least aggressive with the City of Mobile's increase, we have to get close, we have to compete for those same people. What I have learned from Sheriff Cochran is that we do not want a young Deputy Sheriff right out of Afghanistan in a police car; his response would be very different from a seasoned officer. We want to keep our seasoned officers who are used to dealing with the public. You have a commitment from me to do anything I can to keep the people we have.

Mr. Cayton: Even the Corrections Officers, we are losing them fast. A Corrections Officer was recently killed in Atmore, Alabama. It is not only Deputy Sheriffs; Corrections Officers are considered the same.

Commission President Carl: I view y'all as one family.

Mr. Cayton: This past week, we had a Canine (K9) Handler resign on Friday. That separates the Canine (K9) from a Handler because of money issues. He went to work for United Parcel Services (UPS) because they pay more. Now, we have a dog without a Handler, and somebody has to be reunited with that dog to see if they match. It is a problem because it is the second Handler who has left in the last several months. We have an issue, and the County needs to raise the pay to at least the minimum level of the City of Mobile.

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Commission President Carl: I would love any information that will help me understand the numbers and I will do what I can to help.

Mr. Cayton: Thank you.

Paul Burch, Lieutenant, Mobile County Sheriff's Office: Good morning, Honorable Commissioners, and everyone present. I was one of those police officers who left the City of Mobile in 1990, to work at the Mobile County Sheriff's Office because of the pay and benefits, but now, the County has done a complete flip-flop. Law enforcement officers already know they are not going to get rich doing this job, but they do expect to support their families. I do not have to work extra jobs anymore, but many of my friends do, and it cost them time away from their families. Recently, several officers in the Prichard Police Department called in sick with the Blue Flu. Sheriff Cochran did not hesitate to send Deputy Sheriffs to go out there and assist with the patrol function to help the Prichard community until the situation was over. These are the great people who work for you, and all they want is for their pay to reflect their worth.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl: I totally agree with you.

Pamela Laffitte, Representative, Mobile County Merit System Employees Association: Good morning, Commissioners. Some weeks ago, you were given a Pay Disparity Report which shows the pay of our Deputy Sheriffs and Corrections Officers, and the pay of other municipalities in the State of Alabama. What I also included in the Pay Disparity Report was the 2007 Condrey Study of the pay of municipalities in Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, Mississippi and other surrounding states. The City of Mobile Mayor William "Sandy" Stimpson has proposed an ordinance to roll back the City's Police Jurisdiction from 3 miles to 1.5 miles. The Sheriff's Office is already understaffed, and if it is approved, it will stretch the Deputy Sheriffs even thinner, and the same thing is happening with the Corrections Officers. Mobile Metro Jail houses inmates not only of the County but also other municipalities, state, and federal prisons. Some of these prisoners come from dangerous prisons like the William C. Holman Correctional Facility in Escambia County, Alabama, where after an overnight riot left a Corrections Officer and a Warden stabbed, both are expected to be okay. Our Transportation Officers who are Corrections Officers drive 17-hours or more a day on the highways transporting prisoners to and

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from jails, hospitals, medical appointments, and court. Alabama State law requires the Sheriff to house inmates from other municipalities that do not have jails. Deputy Sheriffs, Corrections Officers, and other law enforcement officers are seeing a large number of mentally ill people coming into the jails. The mentally ill inmates are spreading their feces on the walls and throwing their urine at the Corrections Officers, and guess who has to clean it up? The Corrections Officers have to clean it up, we do have Inmate Work Supervisors who help, but most of the time it is the Corrections Officers because of the mentally ill state of mind. The working environment for Corrections Officers is very stressful and dangerous. Both Corrections Officers and Deputy Sheriffs need incentives like State Law Enforcement Officers who have hazardous duty pay and a retirement plan where every five (5) years worked one (1) year is gained. Educational programs would be a good incentive too, Corrections Officers could raise above entry level employees. Please review the information we have provided and ponder on it for about two (2) weeks. Another issue I wanted to bring up is that merit raises are needed, blanket raises or cost-of-living adjustments (COLA) are given to all merit system employees, and it raises the salaries of entry-level positions which causes a problem where new people coming to work with us are almost at the same pay as employees who have been with us several years. If incentives are in placed, and merit raises are given on a regular basis, it would boost morale and retain quality, good workers. Thank you.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl: Thank you.

Sheriff Sam Cochran, Mobile County: Good morning, Commissioners. What the speakers have said is true, we are in difficult times and are approaching a crisis in law enforcement. We are not able to retain and hire qualified Deputy Sheriffs and Corrections Officers. It comes at a time when Police are under fire across the country. The Police have been assassinated, accused of misconduct, some accurately and some falsely, but the pressure upon our Deputy Sheriffs and Corrections Officers is the highest I have seen in my entire career. The pay has degraded over the years, and we have not been able to keep up. The Deputy Sheriffs until the raise you recently gave us, I have been told, is the first merit raise received in approximately sixteen (16) years. We had a kind of reset with the Condrey Study in 2008 and then we went all those years without a merit raise. We have situations where someone has been on the job eight (8) years training someone who makes the same pay. Now, in addition to the dangers of the job, they feel the pressure of their families and friends encouraging them to get out of law enforcement and corrections. Our attrition rate has

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rapidly increased in the last three (3) years, in particularly the last twelve (12) months. It appears that the long dedicated career employees are staying because they have so much invested. We are losing people who have been with us for three (3), four (4) or five (5) years to agencies across the Bay and other states. The first six (6) years I was Sheriff, I only sent three (3) or may be four (4) new recruits to a state police academy. Now, I am sending ten (10) a year and only hiring two (2), three (3) or may be four (4) a year who have been already trained. The expense of training new officers is a waste of money, and we have a much younger workforce instead of a well-seasoned workforce. I still would stack them up against anyone in the southeast in their ability. We are calling upon them to do more and more every day; like the five (5) murders in the City of Citronelle and helping out the City of Prichard. Our Finance Director has been working during the last week and a half on coming up with the cost if we were to adopt a similar pay increase as the City of Mobile. It is a complicated formula, and it takes a lot of time. I am preparing data for the number of increases over the last ten (10) years of new hires we sent to the academy, as well as, the increase of early retirement and those who are resigning. I plan to give you facts and possibly some solutions too, so we are working on it. Historically, for more than twenty (20) years, the salaries of the City of Mobile Police Department and the Sheriff's Office have always stayed the same. Recently, the City of Mobile stepped up big, significantly, for a problem they finally acknowledged and knew they had to do something about it. They were facing a crisis; they had lost more than a hundred officers in a year and a half. This year alone, they have lost approximately forty-five (45) officers. Probably, percentage wise, we may be losing nearly as many, but we are a much smaller force and of course, that gives us some challenges too. I thank you for your attention, and I will be in touch with you with additional data and information.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl: Thank you, Sheriff, and are you including the officers working in the jail in your study report?

Sheriff Cochran: Yes.

Commission President Carl: We do not want to forget them.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: Sheriff, did you want to speak on purchasing that military equipment while you are on the mic?

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Sheriff Sam Cochran, Mobile County: Yes, I will be happy to speak on Agenda Item #2. The 1033 Program is a program where we share in military surplus. It is equipment, supplies, and commodities that the Federal government has already purchased with our tax dollars, and it has become surplus. For years, they have shared it with cities, counties, and law enforcement agencies and it has restrictions on its use. This year, the United States President Barack Obama issued a Presidential Executive Order changing some of the rules on how it is to be done. It requires our governing body to sign off for us to be involved in the program, as well as, a number of categories. I am completely aware of the concerns of over-militarizing law enforcement. I am cognizant of it, and our Deputy Sheriffs know full well what our roles are in the community as peacemakers and problem solvers. Some people may have concerns about armored vehicles, but all the items on the equipment list are commercially available to us anyhow. Armored vehicles can be bought commercially, and if you can buy a similar one from the Federal government, you may save four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) to five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00). There are a number of instances an armored vehicle can be used, and I hope one day we can acquire one. We have been on the waiting list for an armored vehicle for one (1) year and a half, not a huge one, but a smaller one. We could use an armored vehicle to save the lives of our Deputy Sheriffs and citizens, it would help us keep a protective nature. We have no desire to obtain anything like a fixed wing aircraft, even though, it is one of the categories. We do not know what the future holds, but we do expect to see more violence in this country. We are faced with terrorism in addition to the assaults on Police. I would rather be able to apply for something, so if the time or the problem arises, I would not have to go back through some red tape after the fact to try to get equipment that may not be available during a time of a crisis. We have obtained over the years, a range of supplies including forklifts, pallet lifts for our property section, cots and hygiene products for the Metro Jail, boots for inmate trustees who work outside. Again, it is taxpayers dollars that were spent on those things, so it is one way of getting something and saving us in our budget.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: Is my assumption wrong that the National Guard already have this equipment, and if we had a situation where we needed it, they could bring it to the County?

Sheriff Cochran: It would take the National Guard a matter of days. If you listen to the 911-Tapes of the Deputy Sheriffs at the scene where officers were recently assassinated in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, the first thing you hear are the Deputy Sheriffs hollering for a BearCat which is an armored vehicle so they could get to the wounded. The National Guard would be 72-hours away. I was in the

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City of Citronelle three (3) years ago, where a murder suspect had killed his wife. The murder suspect was in the middle of a cemetery, and there was no way to approach him. The only thing our Deputy Sheriffs had to approach him was an old bread truck. When the Deputy Sheriffs finally made an effort to approach him, he waved his gun at them, and they killed him. The outcome might have been different if the Deputy Sheriffs had been able to approach him in an Armored vehicle. An officer was gunned down at Tillman's Corner about twelve (12) years ago, and the officers at the scene had to use a paramedic truck to hide behind to get the officer who was lying in the street shot; the officer survived. It is for situations like those, other than that, we would rarely and hopefully never need it. It would only be brought out in a case of saving the lives of civilians who may be pinned down under a sniper or something like the case of the five (5) officers who were killed in Dallas, Texas.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl: What does your sniper team use now in a situation?

Sheriff Cochran: They use a bread truck.

Commission President Carl: Did you say a bread truck?

Sheriff Cochran: The vehicle we carry equipment and supplies is a converted bread truck, a big box truck.

Commission President Carl: Does it have aluminum sides?

Sheriff Cochran: We do not have an armored vehicle where three (3) or (4) four Deputy Sheriffs could sit in and approach a situation like the Deputy Sheriffs did in Orlando, Florida. There were forty-nine (49) people killed at a nightclub, and the Orlando Police Department had an armored vehicle to crash into the wall while at the same time keeping those inside safe from the sniper's gunfire. When I was a Police Chief, a social club on Saint Stephens Road had three (3) or four (4) people shot, three (3) officers and three (3) people were bleeding inside the building, it took us awhile to get into the building. I would have loved to have had an armored vehicle in that situation, but we finally breached it and saved two (2) or three (3) people who were bleeding to death in that building. There are many situations where an armored vehicle could possibly be used.

Commission President Carl: These are strange times Sheriff.

Sheriff Cochran: These times are strange and dangerous.

Commissioner Connie Hudson: Construction will start on Hitt Road beginning on Wednesday. It will involve flattening the road. There are several issues involving sight visibility problems that citizens along Hitt Road have reported. It goes back to when we first were working toward putting in the recycling center, and really before then. Former Commissioner Mike Dean heard them as well, and at that time we combined District 2 and District 3 Pay-As-You-Go money into a project. To address the problems along Hitt Road by flattening the road and creating a turn lane into the recycling center because it is a very congested road. The electronic signs have gone up indicating that Hitt Road will be closed which should read closed to through traffic and the recycling center is not closed. I got a number of emails this weekend from concerned people about how do they get to the recycling center. My understanding is the access ingress, and egress will be off Schillinger Road to Hitt Road and through the Westside Park entrance, is that correct?

Assistant County Engineer W. Bryan Kegley II: The existing site will remain open to a point. At one point, we are going to have to close down the existing entrance running to the north off of Hitt Road. Then, we will advise them to gain access through the entrance to Westside Park, but for the time being, they will be able to continue to gain access to the recycling center through the existing driveway.

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Commissioner Hudson: When we do the Press Release I want it to be very specific about the information. It is currently open until further notice and at the time whenever the current entrance is closed then the access will be off Schillinger Road through the Westside Park entrance.

Assistant County Engineer Kegley: We will see if we can keep those Variable Message Boards out there on this site for the time being to give them as much information as we can.

Commissioner Hudson: Okay, thank you.

Commission President Jerry L. Carl: I heard that the State is auctioning off 20 acres of the Brewer site.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: They are?

Commission President Carl: That is what was pointed out to me. Jay, what is the procedure? Can anybody approach the State about donating that to the County or giving it to us at a much-reduced price? Maybe we can do our soccer project there or do some expansion. One of the developers reached out to me and wanted to know if we were interested in selling our property. I told them we were not. He was actually going to place a bid on the front part. Is it 20 acres or 40 acres?

Commissioner Hudson: Off of Schillinger?

Commission President Carl: Yes, the front part of the Brewer Center that the State owns. Is it 40 acres?

Commissioner Hudson: I think so. Initially, the property was owned by the County, was it not? It was donated to the State whenever the Brewer Center was built, and then that part of the property was returned, but not all of it. The portion they kept, they put on the market.

Commissioner Ludgood: The frontage.

County Attorney Jay Ross: They gave a portion to the City and a portion to the County, and they kept the frontage on Schillinger Road.

Commissioner Ludgood: We asked for it in the past.

County Attorney Ross: Bryan and I will be happy to reach out to them today.

Commission President Carl: Who are you reaching out to?

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County Attorney Ross: The Department of Mental Health, they owned it way back and divided it between the County and the City, they retained the front section.

Commission President Carl: It is probably the most valuable property in Mobile County, but I am sure we would like to get it for a possible expansion for some other projects we all want to do.
