The main issue I have is I have never met the gentleman, and I don't know that either of you has. I don't know anyone in our Administration who has ever talked to the guy. At the end of the day, although his salary will be reimbursed through the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA) grant, he is still a County employee. I have concerns with appointing or hiring someone that no one at the County Commission has ever met before.

President Hudson: I think that is a valid concern.

Commissioner Dueitt: I had some conversations with Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator, and E. Edwin Kerr, Deputy County Administrator, about maybe setting up some kind of protocol for this appointment and possibly having Andrew Sullivan come down to introduce himself to the Administration or maybe to the Commissioners before we appoint him to this position.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: I like the idea of a protocol.

Commissioner Dueitt: Yes.

Commissioner Ludgood: Certainly, Andrew Sullivan would be eligible to compete in whatever we set up.

Commissioner Dueitt: Yes.

Commissioner Ludgood: I agree with you. It's not about him because I don't know him either. It's about a process, and it's really important. Thank you for raising this up.

Commissioner Dueitt: On the appointments, I didn't mention anything at the Commission Conference on Thursday because I wanted to look into it. Once I looked into it on Friday, it just didn't seem like a good policy to just randomly appoint a person who is going to be drawing a salary from the County. I don't think it merits making the person a Merit System employee because if the grant funding ever ran out, then it would be an employee we have with no funding source. I certainly think we need to have some kind of protocol. I discussed that with Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator, and E. Edwin Kerr, Deputy County Administrator, and they can come to you two (2) gals and discuss what I've discussed to see if that would work for you to have this protocol put in place before we make this appointment.

President Hudson: I think it's a very good idea. Often times, we do take recommendations that are given to us. The appointments don't always necessarily work directly for the County Commission.

Commissioner Dueitt: Yes.

President Hudson: In this case, because they do, I think it's prudent we have an opportunity to meet this individual and talk to them to figure out what that relationship will be like. So let's plan to hold this one over at least until the next Commission Meeting, maybe longer if necessary. It may not be. I don't know. Let's see what we can get set up as far as having Andrew Sullivan come in and meet the Commissioners if you would please.

Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator: It is my understanding it's the Commission's wishes that Andrew Sullivan comes in, or were we opening it up?

Commissioner Dueitt: I would like to have some more conversations with you and E. Edwin Kerr, Deputy County Administrator, about how we are going to move forward. Then maybe at that point, I don't know; I would like to see if we are going to sit down and meet this gentleman and appoint him or if we are going to open this up for other candidates to apply for this job. I know it says appointment, but it's really a person who has a job that gets a direct deposit or a paycheck from the County Commission every other week or every week. I don't know how we're going to move forward. However, you guys feel more comfortable going forward with it.

President Hudson: I'm not opposed to meeting Andrew Sullivan. At that point in time, if when we've met him, we feel like we need to open it up and have other candidates come in to meet, then we can make that decision at that time. I guess Andrew Sullivan was recommended by the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA) and by Dawn Wilhelm.

Commissioner Dueitt: Yeah.

President Hudson: Because of that, I would certainly like to start with him and meet him. I don't know what his qualifications are. I'm like you, I don't know him.

Commissioner Dueitt: It's not that I don't trust their recommendation. I just want to make sure. At the end of the day, he's not going to be working for the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA). He will be working for Mobile County Commission.

Commissioner Ludgood: Before we move on, because this does not happen often, it's kind of anomaly. I think it's important that we have a process. Whatever that process is, unless there is something about the way the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA) does this that limits us, then I think it's appropriate like with any other thing. We have to at least do some kind of advertisement. That's what we do. The only people we get to hire without having to go through all of that are our personal assistants. I think it would be well for us to be consistent to this extent unless there is something we don't know.

Commissioner Dueitt: I agree. I think we should have competitive openings or something for this position. To me, it just seems like everybody that works for the County is a Merit System employee. They have to go through the Personnel Board to get a job. My main concern was that there wasn't any open competitive advertising for the job. The second issue I have is no one at the County Commission has met this guy that we're about to appoint or hire for a County position.

President Hudson: If that's what I'm hearing, we are looking for a protocol that is set up for this position going forward. Andrew Sullivan may be considered, but we want it openly advertised.

Commissioner Dueitt: I think we should. No disrespect to Dawn Wilhelm or the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA). I respect their recommendation. I get that it's a reimbursable job, but ultimately it's a County employee. I think we should be making the decision on who we hire.

President Hudson: These are pass-through funds, are
they not?

Glenn L. Hodge: Yes, they are.

President Hudson: They are the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA) funds coming through the County Commission. They work for the County, but they are the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA) funds. I guess that's why they feel they have a right to be involved in the appointment process.

Commissioner Dueitt: I understand that, but when you get ready to hire a Sheriff's Deputy, they don't go to Mobile Police Department for an interview. They go to the Sheriff's Office for their interview. My understanding is he was interviewed by the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA).

Glenn L. Hodge: That is correct.

Commissioner Dueitt: If they want to go that direction to make a recommendation of who we hire, they can put them on their payroll.

President Hudson: I think we have some time to work
this out.

Glenn L. Hodge: Sure.

President Hudson: Why don't we regroup on this and figure out a way forward that satisfies the desire of the Commission to be more involved in the selection process.

Glenn L. Hodge: Sounds good, Commissioner. We have already started.

Commissioner Dueitt: Thank you.

Commissioner Ludgood: I think this is a good conversation because a month ago, we got a letter saying they were going to shut down the Mobile office.

Commissioner Dueitt: Right.

Commissioner Ludgood: Two (2) weeks ago, we got a letter saying they changed their mind. This is a good time for us. You know how some things just rock along, and you just take them for granted? Now that this has surfaced, this is our opportunity to take a real look at it. We may come back to this same place, but we'll be better informed about what we're doing and what the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA) expects of us.

 $\mbox{ \fontfamily Glenn L. Hodge: }$ Sounds good. We will be working on that.

President Hudson:	Alright.	Thank you.

Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator: This item will be read by Kimberly N. Sanderson, Assistant County Engineer.

Kimberly N. Sanderson, Assistant County Engineer: I am going to read the report signed by W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer, and it is to be submitted to y'all later this week.

As required by Act 2019-2, Section 11(e), known as the Rebuild Alabama Act, we are submitting this report of activities involving projects that were designated to receive funding in the Fiscal Year 2022 Mobile County Transportation Plan, adopted by the County Commission on August 23, 2021. No amendments to the Fiscal Year 2022 Mobile County Transportation Plan were adopted by the County Commission. Also included in this report are the activities of projects still active from prior adopted plans.

The funding categories are divided into two (2) separate columns; one (1) is listed as the County Rebuild Alabama Fund (CRAF) Amount, and one (1) is listed as the Federal Aid Exchange Fund (FAEF) Amount. The County Rebuild Alabama Fund (CRAF) may be used for the maintenance, improvement, replacement, and construction of roads and bridges maintained by the County. The Federal Aid Exchange Fund (FAEF) funds may be used on county roads classified as minor collectors or higher and/or bridge structures on the National Bridge Inspection Inventory.

Mobile County received four million five hundred four thousand three dollars and forty-six cents (\$4,504,003.46) in revenue in Fiscal Year 2022 based on the Rebuild Alabama Act.

There were six (6) projects listed on the approved Fiscal Year 2022 County Transportation Plan for the County Rebuild Alabama Fund (CRAF). Two (2) of these projects had expenditures in Fiscal Year 2022. They are Project RA49-03-22, Swedetown Road and Swedetown Road North, in the amount of one hundred thirty-two thousand fifty-four dollars and thirteen cents (\$132,054.13), and Project RA49-04-22, Road Construction Materials (to be used by the

County's Public Works crews for resurfacing), in the amount of five hundred ninety-eight thousand nine hundred nineteen dollars (\$598,919.00), for a total of seven hundred thirty thousand nine hundred seventy-three dollars and thirteen cents (\$730,973.13). Project RA49-03-22 provided supplemental funding to one of the 2020 Mobile County Transportation Pay-As-You-Go Program projects. The four (4) remaining projects included in the Fiscal Year 2022 plan are still in the preliminary phase but are expected to go into construction in Fiscal Year 2023.

There were no new projects listed for Federal Aid Exchange Fund (FAEF) on the Fiscal Year 2022 plan; however, the Federal Exchange Fund (FAEF) funds are being used on Project RA-MCP-49-82-15 (Project MCR-2014-012(B)), resurfacing Dawes Road from approximately three hundred sixty-five (365) feet north of Scott Dairy Loop Road South to approximately eight hundred (800) feet south of Cottage Hill Road. This project will use the remaining federal aid funds that have been made available to Mobile County through the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT), as well as the Fiscal Year 2020 and the Fiscal Year 2021 the Federal Aid Exchange Fund (FAEF). This project was let to construction through the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) on March 26, 2021, and is an active construction project. A total of eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000.00) of the Rebuild Alabama funding Federal Aid Exchange Fund (FAEF) was spent on this project in Fiscal Year 2022.

In Fiscal Year 2022, there were expenditures for two (2) projects included in the Fiscal Year 2020 plan. They were Project RA49-02-20, Sollie Road, and Project RA49-03-20, Sam Lewis Road, in the total amount of forty-two thousand seven hundred ten dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$42,710.69). Both of these projects are complete.

There were expenditures on four (4) projects in Fiscal Year 2022 included in the Fiscal Year 2021 plan. These expenditures are for Project RA49-02-21, Sand Ridge Road; Project RA49-03-21, Sunset Road Bridge Replacement; Project RA49-04-21, Creola-Axis Loop Road North; and Project RA49-05-21, Road Construction Materials. The total expenditures for these projects in Fiscal Year 2022 are one million eight hundred seventy-four thousand seven hundred seventeen dollars and eighty-one cents (\$1,874,717.81). One (1) remaining project from the Fiscal Year 2021 plan is still in the preliminary phase but is expected to go into construction during Fiscal Year 2023.

Commissioner Dueitt moved, seconded by Commissioner Ludgood, that the Board accept *County Engineer's written report of the Fiscal Year 2022 Mobile County Transportation Plan expenditures. Preliminary engineering costs for the noted projects are funded by the County's general fund. Construction and construction inspection costs are funded by the County Rebuild Alabama Fund (CRAF) and the Federal Aid Exchange Fund (FAEF), provided by Act 2019-2 (Rebuild Alabama Act).

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS AND/OR COMMENTS

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: For the last, I guess, it may be three (3) years, I have been involved with the National Association of Counties (NACo). They host Economic Mobility Leadership Network. We have gone all over the country looking at various diverse counties, such as Mercer County, West Virginia, to Multnomah County, Oregon, to Hennepin County, Minnesota, which is Portland, Oregon, and Minneapolis, Minnesota. What we have been doing is looking at what different communities are doing to try to promote economic mobility in their communities within the confines of what counties can do. This week, we will be hosting them here in Mobile, Alabama. It's about twenty-five (25) from all over the country. We have one (1) more convening after this one (1). This is their first trip to the Deep South. We went to Palm Beach County, Florida, but anywhere with a median house price of six hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$670,000.00) is not the Deep South. This is going to be their first flavor of what it's like to be in the South. Some of them have never been this far south. Dena Pollard, Public Affairs Manager, has been helping the staff with this. The issues we're looking at here are what Mobile County does in partnership with K-12, Community Colleges, and workforce development. We work with the industry because we can't really do economic mobility work. We can work with the entities that do that, and how those partnerships are playing out will hopefully make a difference in the lives of people here in Mobile County. That will be going on. It's on Wednesday, and it starts tomorrow night. They're using the Renaissance Mobile Riverview Plaza Hotel to interview on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. We will finish at midday Thursday morning. I just want to thank each of you who has done anything or contributed in any way to making all of this come together. I appreciate it. Just wanted to let you know it.

President Connie Hudson: So it's representatives from the Economic Mobility Council from this National Association of Counties (NACo) committee?

Commissioner Ludgood: Yes. It's called Economic Mobility Cohort. Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation funded this for the National Association of Counties (NACo). They did a call to anybody who is interested in this. They picked communities. They're going to look at what we do here. We're going, to tell the truth about our limitations as a county in the State of Alabama. I think we have done some great work in spite of that. That's what we will be highlighting.

President Hudson: Okay. Very good. Thank you for sharing.

Commissioner Randall Dueitt: As many of you may know, January 9th is National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day for law enforcement all over the country. Particularly, I want to talk about the law enforcement in our community, our deputies, our many municipalities, and our state and federal officers here in Mobile County. If you get an opportunity today, tell them how much you appreciate what they do. They took a job that put their lives at risk every day. It's a thankless job that takes many of them away from their families for countless hours. I, for one, appreciate law enforcement. I just wanted to remind everybody that today is National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day. If you get an opportunity to thank a police officer, try to do so.

Commissioner Ludgood: Thank you.

President Hudson: Thank you very much for bringing that up. I feel like we should pass a resolution. If we need to do that to signify that and acknowledge that here in Mobile County, why don't we do that?

Commissioner Dueitt: Maybe we could do that. We could get someone to draft a resolution for one of the upcoming Commission Meetings and recognize that in Mobile County.

President Hudson: The role of law enforcement in
Mobile County?

Commissioner Dueitt: And nationwide.

President Hudson: How important it is in serving our citizens and maintaining public safety. They do a great job. I know a lot of times, all we hear is bad news. It's unfortunate. There are so many people out there in law enforcement working so very hard, and as you said, they are sacrificing their time with family and putting their lives on the line to keep our community safe. We're very fortunate. You're right; we need to make sure that we're thanking these people every opportunity that we get and calling attention to what they do. I think whatever we can do to acknowledge that, we certainly should.

Commissioner Ludgood: I think everybody in Mobile County agrees that none of us want to live in a world where there's no law.

President Hudson: Amen.

Commissioner Ludgood: I think we could all agree on
that.

Commissioner Dueitt: If you look across the nation, there are issues with some law enforcement. I don't want to get off on that, but you know, we're really fortunate here. I worked in the law enforcement community for twenty-five (25) years, and we have some really good police officers. I have worked with just about every municipality, state, and federal agencies in Mobile County. We're fortunate to have a great group of law enforcement professionals in our community.

President Hudson: Well said.
