Motion carried unanimously.

Jay Ross, County Attorney: Can I make one comment, Commissioners? At the conference on Thursday, April 23, 2020, Commissioner Merceria Ludgood asked about House Bill 447 that was pending at the Alabama House of Representatives that dealt with Medicaid costs. If House Bill 447 is passed, it could impact the future medical costs associated with a future contract with Naphcare, Inc. We found House Bill 447 has not yet passed, but it is in the system. The bottom line is if it passes and it renews the benefit of prisoners, there could be a reduction in future costs with Naphcare, Inc. in the next fiscal year contract.

Commissioner Connie Hudson: The contract reflects that?

Jay Ross: No. The contract does not reflect that because no one knows if the House Bill 447 will be passed or not. There will be an opportunity to renegotiate the contract for next year at this time for August 1, 2021. If there are any savings if House Bill 447 passes, Naphcare, Inc. says they will look at that.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: Can we provide contingent language where if House Bill 447 passes and the inmate is covered by Medicaid, then that will be a dollar for dollar offset or whatever kind of language?

Jay Ross: I can work on that and maybe we should hold this over to do that.

Commissioner Hudson: I would agree.

Jay Ross: The other question is what is the average daily population. I just want to give you some numbers. In 2016, the average daily population over twelve (12) months was one thousand ninety-eight (1,098) inmates. In 2017, the average daily population for the year was one

thousand one hundred sixteen (1,116) inmates. In 2018, it increased to one thousand four hundred forty-five (1,445) inmates. The average daily population for 2019 was one thousand six hundred nine (1,609) inmates. There were one thousand five hundred fifty-two (1,552) inmates at Metro Jail in January 2020. Last week, it was somewhere between one thousand forty-four (1,044) and one thousand sixty (1,060) inmates. They think when this situation we are experiencing now passes, the number will go back up closer to one thousand five hundred (1,500) or one thousand six hundred (1,600) inmates. I do not know how they know that, but that is what their guess is. The average daily population has picked up substantially over the last few years which has caused the increase with the cost of Naphcare, Inc. In addition to that, President Jerry L. Carl asked some questions about the cost of medicine. They treat all patients and inmates if they have no cost or a lot of costs at the same rate. We are not paying costs per inmate if the inmate's medical costs are more than need be. There is a provision of Federal law under Section 340B, Public Health Service Act, that will provide significant savings for Hepatitis C and HIV medication. In speaking with James Rossler, Attorney, and Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator, earlier last month, they want Naphcare, Inc. to explore working with the Mobile County Health Department to see if they can be the sponsoring governmental entity that can provide those types of medicines at a cheaper price under the oversight of the Mobile County Health Department, which could reduce the cost prospectively. There is no formula in this contract which would specifically identify that. The last question President Jerry L. Carl asked was what are the area hospitals and what are they charging. The short version is they do not go to Providence Hospital because it is too far away, is the perception. Springhill Hospital is not interested in taking the inmates as patients because their rates are high, as I am told. University of South Alabama Medical Center is expensive as is Mobile Infirmary. Mobile Infirmary charges the County eighty-two percent (82%) of all bill charges to Naphcare, Inc. Springhill Hospital will not take patients, but when they did they wanted one hundred thirty percent (130%) of the rate. University of South Alabama Medical Center wants two thousand eight hundred eight dollars (\$2,808.00) per diem per patient plus other costs. The thought is sending the inmates to Mobile Infirmary at this time is the best rate. We will be asked later this summer or autumn to reach out to each of these medical providers maybe with some discussion with the County Commission, if you'd like, to see if we can be able to get some better rates. The Sheriff's Department employee we consulted with thinks the rates we are paying

are high based on national averages. There could be some room to negotiate the prices down. President Jerry L. Carl, James Rossler, attorney, and I had a conversation yesterday. I hope I have not mischaracterized anything we spoke about, President Carl; and if I did, I apologize.

President Carl: No, not at all. The medicines we were talking about are roughly, without giving any prices, about sixty dollars (\$60.00) per tablet, to give you some We are spending about seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000.00) just on medication alone. By following through and getting this code, we can probably take somewhere around twenty percent (20%) off our medication cost. The hospitals are where the real problems are at and where the real cost is coming in. I know I am a short-timer and I am going to be out of here, but I would really encourage y' all, and I have not talked to Sam Cochran, Mobile County Sheriff, but to build a couple of hospital rooms onto Metro Jail would fix a lot of problems. If you have somebody who is in a severe situation such as a heart attack or something life-threatening, to not transfer them will save you about two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per day.

Commissioner Ludgood: I know one of the things we are paying for, the fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00), is some changes to the medical unit. I am not sure what all is involved. I think in 2019, didn't we allocate fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00)?

Commissioner Hudson: Yes

Commissioner Ludgood: I know at the heart of it, it
is something medical.

President Carl: Okay. To keep it there, because everyone we send to Providence Hospital or to University of South Alabama Medical Center, there has to be around the clock security. It would solve a lot of our problems. am not saying hospitals are taking advantage; they are doing business as normal. They are charging full price plus. If you go there as a Medicaid patient, I am going to use round numbers here, it is one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per day. Chances are, they are only receiving eighty percent (80%), which is eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) per day. There is no limit as to what the hospital sets as the price. They could charge two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) a day on the private side for the same service where they are receiving eight hundred dollars (\$800.00). Again, I am not saying that is the margins they have set. We do not know until we start to receive a breakdown of those numbers. Of course, I am going to be out of here in November 2020. Between now and

November, I would like to start pooling those numbers together and give y'all some ideas of what I feel like some corners could be cut. We also need to look at making a contract with University of South Alabama Medical Center, with Mobile Infirmary, or with the other hospitals. It may be cheaper to contract one room for a three hundred sixty-five (365) day period. There are a lot of ways we can try to skin this cat.

Commissioner Hudson: Is there an average population number percentage or overall number that are hospitalized from Metro Jail? I do not know how many prisoners we are talking about.

 ${\bf Jay\ Ross:}$ There may be. I do not know that number as that number has not been discussed. I can find out after this meeting.

Commissioner Hudson: It is definitely worth exploring. I think part of the cost and what we are paying for is professional medical services. I do not think we have a physician on the premises at Metro Jail. I know we have nurse practitioners and so forth. I do not know what the need is for those patients, but I think we could explore and find out. We definitely need to look and see if there is a less expensive way of approaching it with all options on the table.

Jay Ross: I will check. I know that Sam Cochran, Mobile County Sheriff, and his staff have asked for increased staffing for the forthcoming year's contract to deal with the myriad of medical issues and conditions that they face and how that will change in the next few months based on the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) crisis. I do not know but I will try to find out their average number of hospitalized patients for you. I do not have that information. If I may go back for clarification, I have not been line one with Naphcare, Inc. in the negotiation of extension for the forthcoming year. I am told they are good to work with. The Mobile County Sheriff's Department consultant liked the job Naphcare, Inc. does. If we push off this agreement for another two (2) weeks, I will determine where we stand legislatively about passing House Bill 447. I do not know how they will be able to gauge quantitatively the impact of that on savings.

Commissioner Ludgood: That is not what I was proposing.

Jay Ross: I just wanted to be sure I understood.

Commissioner Hudson: It is contingency language in the event that House Bill 447 should pass. We may not be able to take advantage of that.

Jay Ross: If it does pass and we will agree to come back and address that.

Commissioner Ludgood: No. What we are saying is to put in language that allows it to have application during this one (1) year.

Jay Ross: Okay.

Commissioner Ludgood: If it doesn't, then it is just a moot point. Because it is out there, we want to preserve the right to go back in.

Commissioner Hudson: Right.

Jay Ross: Okay. We will put that in there and if that becomes problematic with Naphcare, Inc., then we will come back in two (2) weeks.

Commissioner Hudson: I would think as long as Naphcare, Inc. receives their money, they are not worried about the pay source.

Commissioner Ludgood: They will still get paid. It just reduces our portion of that.

President Carl: The question is who is going to bill
Medicaid? Naphcare, Inc. or the County?

Jay Ross: Or the hospital?

President Carl: Just because Metro Jail is a prison does not mean Medicaid pays it. Medicaid is famous for that. They will approve it but they will not pay it. They will just tell you they are broke. With that said, do we need to start calling our Alabama State Senators to encourage them on House Bill 447? As I understand, they are going to pull a handful of House Bills. They will try to get local bills passed and then they are going to get out of there.

Commissioner Hudson: I think it might be worthy of drafting a letter in resolution format from the County Commission asking for their support and their help in getting it approved.

Commissioner Ludgood: I second that.

President Carl: That was easy enough.

Commissioner Hudson: Done.

Dana Foster-Allen, Finance Director: Commissioners, I just received a text from Natasha Neese, Mobile County Sheriff's Office Finance Director, and she said twenty-seven percent (27%) of the inmates received some sort of hospital treatment. Three percent (3%) of those cases expend one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) or more for their treatment.

Jay Ross: One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00)?

Dana Foster-Allen: Yes. Over one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) or more. Three percent (3%) of the inmates who are hospitalized, their costs exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00).

Commissioner Hudson: Wow. Thank you for getting that information.

President Carl: That is three percent (3%) of fourteen. That puts us close to six hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000.00) to seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000.00). We just have to start chipping away at it and start picking it apart instead of trying to block it together. It is the easiest way. I think it can be done if we want to bring it down. This contract is for eight million dollars (\$8,000,000.00) that we are signing for.

Commissioner Hudson: That sounds high.

President Carl: Annual amount is eight million one hundred nineteen thousand dollars (\$8,119,000.00).

Jay Ross: Correct.

Commissioner Hudson: Which has gone up a couple of
million dollars.

President Carl: Right.

Commissioner Hudson: It was six million dollars (\$6,000,000.00).

President Carl: I do not think health care costs have
gone up that much.

Commissioner Ludgood: The other thing is the Department of Justice has asked Metro Jail to do a classification system. Maybe when the classification system is implemented it will bring down the average daily population. There may be a determination that we have people there who do not necessarily have to be there.

President Carl: Yes. Nurse practitioners have got to work under some type of physician. I would think he or she is over there some period of time during the week.

Commissioner Hudson: Probably so.

Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator: Commissioners, Jay Ross, County Attorney, has recommended that we hold over

Jay Ross: I just want to have the language clear with Naphcare, Inc. Natasha Neese, Mobile County Sheriff's Office Finance Director, is obviously listening. My general conversation with James Rossler, Attorney, is if we do not get this passed today, I do not know the implications if we do or do not.

Commissioner Ludgood: We are not saying hold it over. You are the only one to say hold it over.

Jay Ross: If House Bill 447 passes, we want Naphcare, Inc. to recognize the savings that they receive from the State of Alabama or for Medicaid to pass back to us.

Commissioner Ludgood: All we want is for contingent language that says Naphcare, Inc. will recognize any savings if House Bill 447 passes.

Commissioner Hudson: We could approve this contingent on final legal approval.

Commissioner Ludgood: All this means is that we will have some inmates who will have insurance. That is all it means.

Jay Ross: Okay. We will work on it. If there is a problem with that, I will let you all know.

Commissioner Hudson: If this is time sensitive, Commissioners, would you want to see the final document or do you think we should approve it pending final legal approval?

Commissioner Ludgood: I am nervous because we already passed our notification window on this renewal. I am concerned about pushing it.

Commissioner Hudson: Yes.

Jay Ross: I will work with Naphcare, Inc. and James Rossler, Attorney, today to get the language added. If it becomes problematic on Naphcare Inc.'s side, then we will come back to you and bring it to the next Commission meeting. We will come up with a solution.

Commissioner Hudson: Okay.

Dana Foster-Allen: One more thing, Commissioners. I just received a text message from Natasha Neese, Mobile County Sheriff's Office Finance Director, and the amendment to the contract is two million seven hundred thousand dollars (\$2,700,000.00) over the original.

Jay Ross: We have been paying extra dollars based on the prior average daily population, which makes our net not much higher.

Commissioner Hudson: Right. If you divide it out with the increase in population, it really comes out to about where it was actually.

Jay Ross: That is sort of correct.

Commissioner Hudson: Sort of correct?

Jay Ross: Correct.

Commissioner Hudson: It is in the same ballpark.

Jay Ross: I think the overall cost this year will be higher than last year's.

Commissioner Hudson: It is still a lot.

Commissioner Ludgood: It is a chunk of change.

Commissioner Hudson: Yes, it is a lot. If we can get this number down, I think that would be good.

President Carl: That is a lot of health care.

Commissioner Hudson: Yes.

ADD-ON #4

APPROVE THIRD AMENDMENT/HEALTH SERVICES

Jay Ross, County Attorney: While we are at it, not to digress from Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator, but Agenda Add-On Item #4 is an amendment that was asked to suspend any fluctuations in the average daily population at the end of this contract based on the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) crisis. It is a third amendment to the agreement which the County Commission has been asked to sign, to suspend any adjustments in the average daily population between now and July 31, 2020.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: Isn't the population there declining?

Jay Ross: It is.

Commissioner Ludgood: Basically they are saying to keep paying them even though the population is down.

Jay Ross: If it goes back up before the end of the contract, they would not be entitled to any upward adjustments over the one thousand five hundred (1,500) inmate population number. We can wait on this and get more information.

President Jerry L. Carl: Do you have any idea why it jumped up so high over the last three (3) years? Is there a reason?

Glenn L. Hodge, County Attorney: The population and they increased their employees.

Jay Ross: We are talking about why the average Metro Jail daily population increased.

Glenn L. Hodge: Oh. Okay.

Commissioner Ludgood: It is more complicated. There is an active campaign to keep everyone who is accused of something in jail.

Jay Ross: That is true.

Commissioner Ludgood: There is a full court press against bail going on right now on the other side of Government Plaza.

Commissioner Hudson: At one point, at least Municipal Court inmates could bond themselves out. I do not think they can do that anymore. That has changed.

Jay Ross: Which may be pushing it back up.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood is right. It is a complicated answer that I do not have all of the information to tell you why it is going up. It is clearly going back up from what it was a few years ago. James Rossler, Attorney, tells me on the third amendment, it will have this proposed amendment they are asking us to consider would have no financial negative impact on the County. Clearly if the average daily population stays down, then we may be paying more. If it goes back up, we won't be paying more either.

Commissioner Hudson: What is the purpose of why they want this amendment?

Jay Ross: This is what he said, "In recognition of the fact the parties continue to partner in the provision of providing health care services to the inmates at the Mobile County Metro Jail during these unprecedented public health emergencies." That is what I am told. We can hold that off and I can get some more detailed information.

Commissioner Hudson: Would you? I do not quite understand why we would do this.

President Carl: I am a little confused too. Are they implying they are sending everybody who comes down with Coronavirus (COVID-19) to the hospital?

Jay Ross: I do not think that is what they are implying but I do not know for sure. I know they have a lot of patients over there and they are trying to treat everyone they can in-house.

President Carl: We want them to have fair treatment too but at the same time, we cannot just write blank checks.

Jay Ross: I understand this would not cost us anything but if there were savings, we would not realize them either.

Commissioner Hudson: It may not cost more but if the population is down, then there could be a savings realized.

Jay Ross: That is correct.

Commissioner Hudson: Okay.

Jay Ross: Is Natasha Neese, Mobile County Sheriff's
Office Finance Director, Dana?

Dana Foster-Allen, Finance Director: Yes. She just texted me and said the per diem for inmates over one thousand five hundred (1,500) is two hundred forty-eight dollars (\$248.00) per day. She said they would have to pay us under Average Daily Population(ADP) one thousand five hundred (1,500).

Jay Ross: Maybe we should get more clarification so we are all better informed before the County Commission makes a decision as to Agenda Add-On Item #4 for a third amendment to the Healthcare Services Agreement.

Commissioner Hudson: That would be appreciated.

Jay Ross: Okay. Thank y'all.

Upon the request of Jay Ross, County Attorney, this item was held over.
