MOBILE COUNTY COMMISSION

The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Government Plaza Auditorium, in the City of Mobile, Alabama on Monday, March 28, 2022, at 10:00 a.m. The following members of the Commission were present: Connie Hudson, President, Randall Dueitt and Merceria Ludgood, Members. Also present were E. Edwin Kerr, Deputy County Administrator/Clerk of the Commission, Jay Ross, County Attorney, and W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer. President Hudson chaired the meeting.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Dr. Joseph Laffiette II, Pastor of Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church, Celeste Road, Citronelle, Alabama 36522.

PRESENTATIONS/ RETIREES

President Connie Hudson: This morning, we have a number of recognitions to make for our employees who are retiring during the month of April 2022. When I call your name, if you would please come down and we will join you. We have a certificate of appreciation as well as a lapel pin to present to you. Out of curiosity, I always add it up, and this comes to almost one hundred eight (108) years of dedicated service from these employees in total to Mobile County. Let's give them a round of applause. Thank you so much for your years of service. We are so appreciative, as well as all of the citizens of Mobile County, for your service. We are so proud of that and for everything you have done. President Connie Hudson: Good morning.

David Edwards, People United to Advance the Dream - Mobile, Inc.: Good morning.

President Hudson: For the record, could you give us your address?

David Edwards: I sure can. 670 Fisher Street, Mobile, Alabama 36607.

President Hudson: Thank you.

David Edwards: I am President of People United to Advance the Dream - Mobile, Inc. We have been around for about thirty-two (32) years. We are the organization that orchestrated and did the logistics for the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. celebrations here in the City of Mobile and around Mobile County, along with anything that has to do with Dr. King. In light of the recent increase in gun violence we have in the City of Mobile, April 4, 2022, will mark fifty-four (54) years since the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. We all know it was a bullet that took him out at such a young age.

We would like to do what we can to help curtail, send a message, and say hey, listen. No more silence. Let's end gun violence. With that message, it would take a village to make it happen; the City of Mobile and Mobile County. No area of this world is without gun violence. We understand that. I don't need to repeat the statistics. However, with this particular strategy, what we have come up with and want to implement is if we can get Mobile County, the City of Mobile, and every area that encompasses Mobile County to go to their particular district; we also want all of the churches that would be willing to participate to plan for April 4, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. for the people that live in that particular area to come together and have a moment where we can say on this particular day, we put the guns down. That day would denote there is no gun violence that took place.

What I am asking is that you would use your platform. Use whatever it takes to make sure the message gets out. We need one thousand (1,000) of these posters posted all over the City of Mobile and all over Mobile County. We need banners. I have flyers. I am speaking to different organizations and different churches. This is so we can all say there are more of us against gun violence than those who are for the gun violence. Here is the strategy: Anytime the military plans an attack, they study the enemy. Realizing we are in different places and in different sections of Mobile County, it eliminates or diminishes the opportunity for anyone to try and do something at one place where everyone is gathered. There will be many places. Use the parks, parking lots of shopping centers, whatever it takes in your community. Secondly, it sends a message. They will not have our community because we care about our community. Thirdly, what it says is this. If I leave my gun at home today, there's a very strong possibility that once I realize I didn't need it today, I may leave it there tomorrow. If I leave it there tomorrow, then possibly I could leave it there the next day.

It's a stand that says hey, listen. We are not going to stand by and not do or say anything. We need help getting this message out. We need the media to make sure everyone understands on this day, we are going to leave our guns at home, except for the law enforcement. If everyone has the message and knows that at 6:00 p.m. on April 4, 2022, we are going to gather at whatever location we are in. It could be Theodore, Citronelle, Chunchula, or Eight Mile. Whatever area you're in, we are going to gather together. Our churches are going to gather together in the parking lot. We are going to be gathering together with our County Commissioner in one area. We are going to gather in the park. The message is wherever you get together, that would portray it out to the people. That is what we would like to see happen on April 4, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and the day he was assassinated.

President Hudson: Thank you so much, Mr. Edwards, for being here today and sharing this with us. I applaud you and commend you for looking at this pervasive problem and trying to help get a handle on it. This is so important. I think the idea is great. Do you have some digital information you could send to our Public Affairs Director so we can help spread the word?

David Edwards: Absolutely.

President Hudson: If you will do that, we will certainly do all we can.

David Edwards: Thank you. President Hudson: Thank you.

President Connie Hudson: Good morning and welcome.

Chris Curry, President, Mobile Airport Authority: Good morning. It's actually a great morning. Commissioners, on behalf of the Mobile Airport Authority. I am here to thank you sincerely for your investment in the Mobile Downtown Airport. The terminal project is expected to be complete in Autumn 2024. The project is expected to produce somewhere around three thousand three hundred (3,300) jobs. It is the goal of the Mobile Airport Authority to make sure that everybody is included in the prosperity that comes with building the airport. Large businesses, small businesses, minority businesses, disadvantaged businesses, we want to make sure that nobody is left behind. With your hopeful approval today of an investment in the Mobile Airport Authority, it would put us at about two hundred seven million dollars (\$207,000,000.00) of investment at hand. The project is estimated at about two hundred fifty million dollars (\$250,000,000.00). The local investment goes a long way to help us leverage State of Alabama funding and other federal funding. I am here to thank you sincerely for your investment in the Mobile Downtown Airport.

President Hudson: You are most welcome. We are excited about the project. We think it has great potential. We are happy to be partners. We appreciate you being here today.

Chris Curry: Thank you. I certainly thank you for being a part of this.

Commissioner Randall Dueitt: Thank you, Chris. It's good seeing you.

Chris Curry: Alright. Thanks.

2022 COUNTY LEGISLATIVE REPORT

E. Edwin Kerr, Deputy County Administrator: Good morning, Commissioners. We would like to begin with the March 18, 2022 Legislative Report from the Association of County Commissions of Alabama (ACCA). They have highlighted four (4) legislative achievements. The first

being a public vote on constitutional amendment to expand local broadband services in underserved areas. Next is the final passage of bill providing county Emergency Management Agency (EMA) offices with better access to federal funding. Next is the final passage of bill helping address national mental health crisis in county jails. Finally, the final passage of bill expanding access to county tax lien auctions.



Through its involvement in the Association of County Commissions of Alabama, the County Commission works in unison with all 67 counties during the Regular Session of the Alabama Legislature to strengthen our ability to enhance county government efficiencies and services to residents.

Thus far in the month of March, the County Commission's legislative advocacy efforts through continued communication and collaboration with state legislators and fellow commissioners across Alabama have resulted in the following legislative achievements for the county, our residents and the state as a whole:

· Granting a public vote on constitutional amendment to expand local broadband services in underserved areas

The Senate granted final passage to House Bill 255 by Rep. Randall Shedd and Sen. Clay Scofield on March 10 and sent the proposed constitutional amendment to the Secretary of State for placement on the November 8 general election ballot. If approved by Alabama voters, this proposed amendment to the Alabama Constitution will grant counties and municipalities across the state the authority to financially partner with internet service providers to expand residents' access to broadband.

· Final passage of bill providing county EMA offices with better access to federal funding

The Senate granted final passage to House Bill 3 by Rep. Allen Treadaway and Sen. Shay Shelnutt on March 15 and has sent the bill to Gov. Kay Ivey for her consideration and signature. If signed into law, the legislation will allow our emergency management professionals to be statutorily recognized for the public safety services they perform every day and subsequently provide our emergency management departments with better access to federal funding opportunities.

Final passage of bill helping address national mental health crisis in county jails
 The Senate granted final passage to House Bill 70 by Rep. Rex Reynolds and Sen. Rodger Smitherman on March 17 and
 has sent the bill to Gov. Kay lvey for her consideration and signature. If signed into law, the legislation will be a positive
 step toward addressing the growing number of individuals across the nation who are suffering from mental illness and
 incarcerated in a county jail. Specifically, the bill will allow our local law enforcement to partner with our local community
 mental health officer to connect individuals who pose a real and immediate threat to themselves and others with much needed medical evaluation and possible treatment.

Final passage of bill expanding access to county tax lien auctions
 The Senate granted final passage to House Bill 371 by Rep. Corley Ellis and Sen. Jack Williams on March 17 and has
 sent the bill to Gov. Kay lvey for her consideration and signature. If signed into law, the legislation
 will expand access to and participation in county tax lien auctions by allowing for these auctions
 to be conducted online. Expanded access and participation, in turn, will allow for more
 competitive auction rates and less financial tax burdens for residents.
