MOBILE COUNTY COMMISSION

The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Government Plaza Auditorium, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, March 8, 2021 at 10:00 A. M. The following members of the Commission were present: Merceria Ludgood, President, Connie Hudson and Randall Dueitt, Members. Also present were Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator/Clerk of the Commission, Jay Ross, County Attorney, and W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer. President Ludgood chaired the meeting.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Chaplain Phillip Snodgrass, Mobile County Sheriff's Office.

President Merceria Ludgood: We have some very special guests with us this morning, the first of whom is the brand new University of South Alabama Football Coach, Coach Kane Wommack. I would like to invite you to the podium to say hello.

Nick Lawkis, Executive Director of Government Relations, University of South Alabama: Commissioners, I'm going to give a quick introduction for Coach Kane Wommack before he comes up here. I wanted to thank all three of you for giving us a minute of your time this morning. I think the most important thing of this is that Coach Kane Wommack is not all about just winning football games; he's a community guy. He brought his entire family back to Mobile, Alabama. He wanted to be here and he is doing a lot of work right now to really engage and invest himself in his staff and the whole football program into this community. One of the first things he did was have his staff reach out to me to say we needed to get out into the community, we needed to meet folks, we need to get to know them, and that's why we're here today. I'd like to introduce Coach Kane Wommack.

Kane Wommack, University of South Alabama Football Coach: Thank you very much for that. Commissioners, I appreciate that I get to be here today and to engage with you. I am very excited to be the head coach at the University of South Alabama. This is a place that my wife, Melissa Wommack, and I care deeply about. We love southern Alabama, but we also love Mobile a great deal. I think when you look at the landscape of our country and you look at the landscape of college football, it is important outside of the X's and O's of the game that we engage on a

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very dynamic level. The opportunity to do that in a city like Mobile, Alabama, which is so diverse, I think football is an opportunity to connect people from different backgrounds. My role in that is to win football games here and to put a product on the field that the City of Mobile and the University of South Alabama can be very excited about. At the same time, we are building young men that will go back to their communities, including those that stay in this community, and have a tremendous influence across the State of Alabama and in our community. I think it is important to keep those things at the forefront of our minds in terms of how we're developing players and student athletes alike. I want to thank you for the contributions you have made to the University of South Alabama, specifically the Mobile County Commissioners Center for Student Athlete Success. What a tremendous building and what a tremendous facility for our student athletes across the board, not just our football team, to be able to engage in their academic progress through that facility and the resources we have been able to give them is absolutely tremendous. I wish that was something we had four years ago when I was here. To see the growth we're making and the contributions that you have made for that is very appreciated on our end as well as the excitement that our new stadium has brought to our campus and to our community. The feedback from the Reese's Senior Bowl was truly phenomenal from a few weeks ago. Jim Nagy, President of Reese's Senior Bowl, said the feedback he received from the National Football League (NFL) organization and people in the community said being able to use our facilities and resources was positive. That is a tremendous thing that we look for moving forward as a community. It's really important that we connect on a dynamic level and we want to do a great job of engaging the City of Mobile. I am here at your service and wanted to make sure that I make it known the University of South Alabama football team is here to connect to the City of Mobile. We would like to do that in any way possible. Thank you.

Commissioner Connie Hudson: Thank you, Coach Kane Wommack. We're excited for your team leadership. We welcome you back to Mobile, Alabama. Thank you for being here today. We wish you all the best of luck.

Kane Wommack: Thank you so much. I look forward to connecting with the community.

President Merceria Ludgood: I would like to call on Commissioner Connie Hudson to introduce our next very special guest.

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Commissioner Connie Hudson: It is my pleasure this morning to introduce the UMS-Wright 4A and 5A Division Boys' Indoor Track State Champions. If they will come down along with Coach Pat Galle, we have some Certificates of Recognition to give them. Isn't this a good looking group? Let's give them a round of applause. They are State Champions, ladies and gentlemen. They won the State Championship on February 5, 2021 in Birmingham, Alabama. They competed in ten (10) of the fourteen (14) events. We have two (2) athletes who won individual State Championships. Joseph Perry won the 1,600 meter and the 3,200 meter and Philip Hunt won the long jump. Congratulations. UMS-Wright Preparatory School has participated in track at the State level since the early 1960's. This is the fifteenth (15th) State Championship for the boys' team. This is also Coach Pat Galle's sixty-eighth (68th) State Championship. He has been at UMS-Wright Preparatory School for forty-nine (49) years. I wondered how it is possible to have sixty-eight (68) State Championships and he explained to me that he coaches both boys and girls, indoor and outdoor track teams. That is how it is possible, but it is quite an undertaking for a forty-nine (49) year career to have sixty-eight (68) State Championships. That is truly amazing. Let's give him a round of applause as well. We have Certificates of Recognition for the team today.

Pat Galle, Indoor Track Team Coach, UMS-Wright Preparatory School: I would like to congratulate these guys. There are three (3) seniors. We have five (5) football players, four (4) cross-country runners, and one (1) who didn't do anything in the fall. We get a good cross section of all of our athletes, especially for the indoor track because it's a chopped up season due to Christmas in the middle of it. For these guys to go from November through the Christmas holidays and then come back, along with the Coronavirus Pandemic (COVID-19) this year, this was a pretty good accomplishment.

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We trailed the entire meet until the last two (2) events and then we moved ahead. It was a pretty good comeback finish for us. I am really proud of them.

Commissioner Hudson: Thank you, Coach Galle. Again, thank you all for being here today and congratulations. We wish you the best of luck on all of your future endeavors. We want more State Championships, Coach Galle.

Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator: This item was removed from the agenda.

Commissioner Randall Dueitt: Why was this removed?

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W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer: Commissioners, the amended version of Senate Bill 107 addressed the majority of the concerns the Engineering Department had. There is one remaining issue and we had an opportunity to speak with Sonny Brasfield, Executive Director of Association of County Commissions of Alabama (ACCA) on Sunday. He assured us that it will be addressed in further amendments to this bill. We withdraw our objections.

Commissioner Dueitt: I asked because I worked on this all weekend. I asked Beth Marietta Lyons, attorney, to be here if we needed her. I don't know if Senator Chris Elliott was able to make it or not. Hopefully it will meet our satisfaction.

W. Bryan Kegley II: I hope so too.

Commissioner Connie Hudson: I have a question about the amendment. It does not have the financial impact on the County anymore? Does it still roll back the planning jurisdiction?

Richard Mitchell, Public Works Director: It rolls back the planning jurisdictions back to the police jurisdictions. The main concern we had was the building inspections. It allows any municipality that is currently utilizing the building inspections outside of their police jurisdiction to continue to do that. Most of them do not want to pull back.

Commissioner Hudson: It rolls it back to the mile and half?

Richard Mitchell: It rolls it back to the police jurisdiction.

Commissioner Dueitt: Beth Marietta Lyons, attorney, may be able to speak more on this, but I do not think it does anything that's not already allowed by state law.

Richard Mitchell: Correct.

Commissioner Dueitt: I think the City Council could vote to do it and it would take effect in January 2022. Some of the things I read in the bill are actually better than what the current law is with the rollback and the amount of time. One of the main concerns is this bill takes effect in ninety (90) days after passage or signed by Governor Kay Ivey. I talked to Senator Chris Elliott over the weekend and that language is coming out of the bill. He assured me he would work with us to make sure we had a significant amount of time. I don't think he has any say over it right now with the state law as it stands. That is my opinion of the bill.

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Commissioner Hudson: The ninety (90) day issue of concern was the fact that we would be taking over the responsibility and the cost associated with it.

W. Bryan Kegley II: That is correct.

Commissioner Hudson: If that issue goes away, then it's a moot point.

Commissioner Dueitt: The ninety (90) day clause just says that the bill takes effect then.

Commissioner Hudson: Right. It means the responsibility would pass to the County. If that is not the case if the city is going to continue to issue the permitting, then that goes away.

Richard Mitchell: It does. They are looking at adding language that if they choose to make that decision to pull back even their building permit, it would go into effect on January 1, 2022 like everything else. It would give the County time to gear up to do it. The language in contest right now is about the exemption for family division and it widely expands that. We talked to Sonny Brasfield, Executive Director of Association of County Commissions of Alabama (ACCA), this morning and he said that language was not supposed to be in there in that form. It was supposed to address just the municipalities, but the way it's in there, it affects everybody. He said if it does not get changed, then the Association of County Commissions of Alabama (ACCA) as a whole would be against the bill. It is language they have been fighting for years.

Commissioner Hudson: Okay. Will you keep us posted on the status of that?

Richard Mitchell: Yes, ma'am. He felt like that would be changed.

Commissioner Dueitt: There will be a substitute bill introduced tomorrow morning. I'll get a copy of it and forward it out to everyone.

Commissioner Hudson: So it will be a substitute bill and not amendments to the existing bill?

Commissioner Dueitt: It went to a subcommittee and was substituted and amended. Now it came out of the subcommittee and went back to the House committee. There will be a substitute of the substitute.
