INVOCATION

The invocation was given by President Jerry L. Carl, District 3.

MOBILE COUNTY RECOGNIZES National Hispanic Heritage Month

WHEREAS:

The Mobile County Commission does hereby recognize National Hispanic Heritage Month, being celebrated September 15 - October 15, 2020; this year's theme - Hispanics: Be Proud of Your Past, Embrace the Future - invites Hispanics to embrace their backgrounds, to be proud of who they are and where they came from; AND

WHEREAS:

Hispanic Heritage Week, which began in 1968 under President Lyndon Johnson, was expanded to National Hispanic Heritage Month by President Ronald Reagan and enacted into law in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15, the day which represents the anniversary of independence for five Latin American countries;

WHEREAS:

With the term Hispanic or Latino or Latinx referring to Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin regardless of race, Hispanic Americans have helped to shape our communities throughout Mobile County and have had profound influences through a strong commitment to family, faith,

Frank Barragan: We thank you very much. We would like to let individuals know throughout the United States, throughout the State of Alabama, and throughout Mobile County and City of Mobile that we are very proud of our heritage. Our heritage makes us who we are today. It is incredible what we have learned through our heritage to help us respect what it means to be in this great United States of America. A good portion of us are citizens of the United States. There is a large portion that are non-documented in the United States. I can assure you the non-documented people are very proud and consider themselves as citizens of the United States. They will continue to be proud, continue to develop their communities so everyone in our county, in our cities, in our state, and especially in the United States of America will be proud of the communities we live in. We hope everybody will take the message and realize that we do pay taxes. This is not a political statement. Non-documented individuals are not receiving any benefits. They are not receiving any benefits whatsoever. I am going to close with telling you that I am a descendant of Mexico. My father is from Mexico. We lived for twenty-one (21) years, all eight (8) of us, with my father being non-documented. Unfortunately, he wanted to divorce my mother but he couldn't because he was not an American citizen. He became a citizen so he could divorce my mother. The message is not to get divorced but we live proudly. We never knew my father was non-documented because he was proud. He raised us as community leaders. He became a citizen in 1973 or 1974. When he became a citizen, it took him sixteen (16) months. Now it can take up to twenty-two (22) years to become a citizen. That is a major problem. We as Latinos, we as Hispanics, we as Latinx are very proud of our United States of America and we will continue to be proud. We just want to work together for equality and justice for all. Thank you, Commissioners.

W. Bryan Kegley II: If that is the case, Commissioner, then the next step would be to initiate the relocation of any necessary utilities. Once that is completed, then we can bid it for construction.

It is only about fifteen (15) feet wide. There might be some drainage pipes under it per Tyler.

President Jerry L. Carl: In between the buildings?

Jay Ross: Yes, in between buildings.

Commissioner Ludgood: Okay, so that is why they need it. I understand. I was thinking mineral rights.

Jay Ross: No. No mineral rights.

Commissioner Ludgood: Okay.

President Carl: It is a glorified breezeway.

HOLD PUBLIC HEARING/RECEIVE CITIZEN COMMENTS ABOUT PROPOSED AMENDMENT/ 2020 ACTION PLAN FOR THE CDBG-CV FUNDS AND THE HOME PROGRAM

Commissioner Ludgood asked if any citizen of the County wanted an opportunity to be heard, for or against, the proposed amendment to the 2020 Action Plan for the Community Development Block Grant-Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds and the HOME Program. This information has been available to the public since October 2, 2020. The comment period started October 5, 2020.

Nayyer Mahdi, Grants Director: Thank you. Pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has allocated a total of one million seven hundred fifty-four thousand one hundred sixty-five dollars (\$1,754,165.00) of Community Development Block Grant-Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds to Mobile County. These funds are specifically to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the Coronavirus. Funds are to be spent within six (6) years of the date of the grant agreement between the County and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), with eighty percent (80%) being spent within the first three (3) years. That is about one million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000.00).

In addition, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provided several waivers from the regular Federal Regulations. One of which is reducing the required thirty (30) day comment period for citizen participation to five (5) days. Therefore, for this amendment, the five (5) day public comment period began on October 5, 2020 and ends at 5:00 P.M. on October 9, 2020. The ad was available on October 2, 2020. The public hearing is held today, October 8, 2020. The Mobile County Commission will consider adopting the amendment at the Commission Meeting to be held at 9:30 A.M. on Tuesday, October 13, 2020.

What are the proposed projects to be funded with the Community Development Block Grant-Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds? The County proposes to fund five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) to agencies for food banks, community kitchens, and food pantries to distribute food to persons impacted with economic hardship due to COVID-19. Secondly, the County proposes to earmark six hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$620,000.00) for mortgage, rental, and utility assistance as well as legal services. This is to provide emergency payments for delinquent mortgage, rental, and utilities for purposes of preventing evictions or foreclosures. Funding will include assistance with legal issues in cases involving foreclosures, evictions, and

domestic violence, which can lead to homelessness. Assistance will also be provided with identifying and applying for other benefits for individuals and their families, such as unemployment benefits, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). We have budgeted three hundred fifty thousand eight hundred thirty-three dollars (\$350,833.00) for administration. This provides for overall program administration, including but not limited to planning, implementation, reporting, and staff costs. There is two hundred eighty-three thousand three hundred eighty-two dollars (\$283,382.00) earmarked for public service activities to be identified.

Now let's talk a little bit about our regular HOME Program, which is part of the amendment. Although no HOME Program funds were provided from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provided a waiver for the regular fifteen percent (15%) shoulder that shall be set aside for the regular HOME Program. The shoulder set aside is eighty-seven thousand one hundred twenty-four dollars (\$87,124.00). The County will add that to the Rental Housing Program. Also, the County received Program Income and Recaptured Funds for a total of five hundred ninety-four thousand nine hundred six dollars (\$594,906.00). We will add that to the HOME Program budget. Therefore, activities to be funded with our regular HOME Program will be the Rental Housing Program, which is acquisition, development, and construction, for one million sixty-one thousand one hundred sixty dollars (\$1,061,160.00) and administration of one hundred fourteen thousand five hundred seventy-two dollars (\$114,572.00). The total HOME budget is one million one hundred seventyfive thousand seven hundred thirty-two dollars (\$1,175,732.00).

With that, Commissioners, I hand it back to Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator.

Commissioner Connie Hudson: Just a question for clarification. Have these funds have been transferred already or are these reimbursable?

Nayyer Mahdi: We will receive the funds once we actually transmit the amendment on Tuesday when the Commission approves the amendment.

Commissioner Hudson: Okay. That makes sense. The funds will come up front, correct? They are not paid in arrears?

Nayyer Mahdi: The funds will be in the Treasury and will be earmarked for us. We will draw as needed, whether it is on a reimbursement basis or as we are reimbursed. Almost like a reimbursement.

Commissioner Hudson: Okay. Very good. Thank you for the great work you and the Grants Department do with our Grants Program.

Nayyer Mahdi: We appreciate that.

Commissioner Hudson: You keep us all straight. That
is good.

Nayyer Mahdi: Thank you, Commissioner.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: The public hearing is now closed.

WHEREAS, the Mobile County Commission is authorized by law to take certain action to protect the safety and welfare of the public upon a determination that an emergency or disaster has occurred or is imminently like to occur; and

WHEREAS, there is an existing and increasing possibility of an emergency or disaster in that the National Hurricane Center has forecast that the path of Hurricane Delta may cross in or around Mobile County, Alabama possibly within the next 24 hours;

WHERAS, Mobile County, along with other Alabama counties, has entered into regional pre-event debris removal and monitoring services contracts for services in the event of a natural disaster necessitating debris removal; WHEREAS, said service contracts require that in the event county desires to utilize the services of debris removal and/ or monitoring, the county will forward to the contractor a written Notice to Proceed on a form prepared for that purpose;

WHEREAS, the Mobile County Commission on the 24th day of August, 2020 adopted by resolution a memorandum of understanding between Mobile County Commission and the Town of Dauphin Island whereby the County Commission assumes responsibility for debris removal and monitoring services and provides for such services to be provided in the jurisdictional limits of the Town of Dauphin Island pursuant to the County's regional pre-event debris removal and monitoring services contracts;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that

1. The Mobile County Commission determines that an emergency or disaster is imminently likely to occur relating to Hurricane Delta and declares a local state of emergency.

- 2. - 4. The Commission requires that all department heads remain in Mobile County for the duration of the emergency.

The Commission does hereby authorize the President or Vice President of the Commission, acting on its behalf, and in light of developing weather and safety conditions resulting from the approach of Hurricane Delta, to close, as necessary, Mobile Government Plaza and the annexes thereto, such authority to continue in effect through the duration of the storm.
