MOBILE COUNTY COMMISSION

The Mobile County Commission met in regular session in the Mobile Government Plaza Auditorium, in the City of Mobile, Alabama, on Monday, September 12, 2022, at 10:00 A. M. The following members of the Commission were present: Connie Hudson, President, Randall Dueitt and Merceria Ludgood, Members. Also present were Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator/Clerk of the Commission, Jay Ross, County Attorney, and W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer. President Hudson chaired the meeting.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Pastor David Smith, Oak Park Church, 3321 Sollie Road, Mobile, Alabama 36695.

LOVE YOUR COMMUNITY CHECK PRESENTATION

President Connie Hudson: Today, we have quite a crowd. It's good to see everyone. Love Your Community Program have some special presentations to make; some grants presentations, which are always exciting. I invite Evelyn DeAngelo and Dianne Martin to come forward. Dianne Martin will be reading this morning. We have several categories of the Love Your Community Program recipients. It is always exciting, and it's a win-win for the community. All of these groups have worked very hard to remove litter and debris. As a reward, they receive grant money when they reach a certain threshold, allowing them to make public improvements or improvements on public right-of-ways around neighborhoods, schools, and businesses. That is why it is a win-win for our community. Y'all are doing a wonderful job. I turn it over to you, Dianne Martin.

Dianne Martin, Love Your Community Program: Thank you, Commissioner Connie Hudson, Commissioner Merceria Ludgood, and Commissioner Randall Dueitt. We appreciate the opportunity for Keep Mobile Beautiful to be married with Love Your Community Program and working hard to keep our whole County looking better. 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President Hudson: That was a great way to start the meeting. Congratulations to all the teams, and thank you so much for your hard work, and keep it up. I want to recognize Dr. Hannah Hart, President, Keep Mobile Beautiful. We are so glad to have you here today.

Dr. Hannah Hart, President, Keep Mobile Beautiful:
Thank you.

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President Connie Hudson: Do we have any speakers?

Sharee Broussard, Public Affairs Director: We have several speakers on Agenda Item #48, a preliminary plat only of Anglebrook Subdivision, and a speaker about Mobile Government Plaza signs.

President Hudson: When you say several, how many do we have?

Sharee Broussard: Three (3) on Agenda Item #48 and one (1) about Government Plaza signs. Would you like the sign first or the neighborhood?

President Hudson: As they are signed in.

Sharee Broussard: Okay.

Aubrey Bishop, 8946 Cottage Hill Road, Mobile, Alabama; Anglewood Subdivision, Agenda Item #48: Good morning all, and thank you for allowing me to be here to speak my concerns about the upcoming development of Anglebrook Subdivision at McFarland and Cottage Hill Road. I have given y'all binders so you can follow along with me, and I will leave a binder with the County Administrator for it to be placed on file. I want to go on record opposing Anglebrook Subdivision preliminary plat as it is currently drawn. There are many issues that have not been addressed, and the County Commission needs to look at those issues and work on solutions before any attempt to approve the preliminary plat of Anglebrook Subdivision. I have tried to get copies of a current water runoff study with a backwater model because if you run two (2) streams together, you're going to have a situation where all of it will back up. All this water runoff runs through my front yard, which has been that way for years. When the Spring Grove Subdivision was built in 2012, there was flooding in the Quail Crossing Subdivision. Please open the binder under the first tab; it shows a picture of me standing in my driveway. The following picture shows a lady standing in the middle of the street at the Quail Crossing Subdivision. The next picture is of the Spring Grove Subdivision, where you see very little water because their water management plan worked perfectly for that subdivision; they did not consider the people who were downstream. That was in 2012. The binder's second tab shows the Climatological Record for 2017, and the water was about the same for that particular day as it was in 2012, just a little bit different. The picture of my driveway shows it's flooded, and I cannot get out. The water runs toward the culverts down at Cottage Hill Road, trying to go through two (2) six-inch pipes. The pipes were smaller,

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but the County enlarged those two (2) pipes to six feet. In my opinion, that is not the appropriate way to move the water with round pipes. The next picture shows the flooding at Quail Crossing Subdivision, and then the following picture shows Cottage Hill Road and how close the water is to going over Cottage Hill Road.

Commissioner Randall Dueitt: What year are the last three (3) pictures?

Aubrey Bishop: Those pictures were taken in 2017. The Climatological Record is under the binder's second tab, showing you the amount of water. There is also a Climatological Record for 2012 under the binder's first tab. Three (3) weeks ago, I was told we had an unusual amount of water in Mobile, Alabama. The Climatological Record for August 18, 2022, was two inches of water, and it ran over my driveway, but I could get out; it was not nearly as deep. Some people suggested we just had a hundred-year flood in 2012. The Climatological Record for the last twenty-two (22) years shows you how much water Mobile, Alabama, has received each month. The third binder's tab has copies of the plat submitted to the County for approval, showing the detention ponds holdings. The Anglebrook Subdivision plat proposed five (5) detention ponds that are all dumped together with one discharge point, which discharges directly into Cottage Woods Court, which will include flooding. Trust me, I have seen it; I have lived there for forty-five (45) years. I have watched a lot of this water and additions. You got Irongate Subdivision, Spring Grove Subdivision, and Quail Cross Subdivision. Now, you want to add another one, AngleBrook Subdivision, to dump water into the same place, which is my front yard. Thank you for the opportunity to speak, and I hope you have a chance to look through the binder I presented to you.

President Connie Hudson: Are you saying that before the development of those subdivisions, you did not experience this type of flooding?

Aubrey Bishop: No, ma'am, we did not.

President Hudson: Did it get subsequently worse with each development?

Aubrey Bishop: It has gotten worse over the years. There are no studies done to see it. We approve subdivisions and look at the subdivision plan, which shows the great water management plan, but nobody looks to see how the water will affect those downhill. Instead of trying to fix this on the back end, I would hope you could fix it on the front end, just like the situation at Publix when the parking lot flooded. When they did the

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development, it needed to be fixed on the back end, not on the front end. Thank you.

Commissioner Dueitt: Are your most recent photographs included in the binder from 2017?

Aubrey Bishop: Yes. I don't have one past that time. The most recent rain was three (3) weeks ago, and I didn't take pictures of it because it wasn't nearly as great. I had approximately two to three inches of water running across my driveway. I could still get out of my driveway.

Commissioner Dueitt: There have been steps by the County to improve the situation since 2017.

Aubrey Bishop: I have not seen any. In the binder, I addressed two (2) other things: traffic, a huge problem at Cottage Hill Road, and the demand that will be placed on public safety with the addition of more people.

President Hudson: Thank you.

Aubrey Bishop: Thank you.

Charles K. Muse, Quail Crossing Subdivision, 2255 Partridge Way, Mobile, Alabama 36695; Anglewood Subdivision, Agenda Item #48: We want to bring a few things into the light for you to consider concerning protecting our homes and property. We have had ongoing flood issues for many years. We have the Irongate Subdivision, where its water flows into the top part of our subdivision under Dawes Road with inadequate drainage. They have a zero retention pond, so the water discharges under Dawes Road, which comes directly into Quail Crossing Subdivision, and this issue has never been addressed in twenty (20) years. Up the hill was approved for Spring Grove Subdivision, and they were allowed to put in a zero retention pond with multiple forty-eight-inch pipes discharging directly into my backyard. We have done many improvement projects throughout the years of cleaning the drainage area for those two (2) sources to go through our neighborhood. The water discharges at Aubrey Bishop's property and goes under Cottage Hill Road, which is the furthest downhill point where all of the subdivisions discharge into one (1) source. Are there any additional stressors without major improvements to the area of Cottage Hill Road to get us back to where we were ten (10) years ago when we had the flooding of homes, property loss, and in-ground pool loss because of backup flooding? The area is cleared now, and we have drainage leaving the properties, but as Mr. Bishop has stated, would studies be done? The development of the Spring Grove Subdivision was

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approved. What will the County do to help protect us? We already had a drainage issue from the development of the Irongate Subdivision that has not been addressed, and we suffer the consequences of it. We are pleading with the County Commission to look further into this drainage issue. There need to be drainage studies on the effects it will have on downhill property owners. If we continue to develop uphill, we will cause further damage downstream. I want it to be on record that Quail Crossing Subdivision's residents voiced their concerns and pleaded with the County Commission to look further into the drainage issue.

President Hudson: Any questions? Thank you.

Ercil Godwin, Sawgrass Consultant, Anglebrook Subdivision; Anglebrook Subdivision, Agenda Item #48: It seems like the biggest question this morning is related to the stormwater runoff. Maybe some of it is what's generated or would potentially be generated from Anglebrook Subdivision or this piece of property. It may be some issues with some adjacent subdivisions in terms of when they were approved and what the stormwater requirements were at the time of those approvals. In terms of Anglebrook Subdivision, I think some of the issues that probably are seen by the adjacent property owners here is that the property is not developed, so there is no stormwater management. There is nothing in place on the property today that helps slow down or control stormwater runoff. I imagine some property owners see uncontrolled water from this property because it is in a natural state. They may find where the water consolidates in a single location or drains through their property. In terms of Anglebrook Subdivision, if we are approved and move forward with the construction, we will make sure we meet all the County stormwater requirements, which require a detention pond. A significant detention pond will be constructed on the site. The water will be controlled in terms of the discharge going from its current state; it will be collected, stored, and released in a manner that will not allow a negative impact downstream. I think there could be some resolution to some of the issues in that we will have detention ponds that meet County regulations and so forth to help with that. As far as the other subdivisions, I can't really speak on those because I am not sure how those subdivisions were designed. I know we must consider off-site stormwater that comes on our property, and we have to deal with that as well. If it is not draining to our side, unfortunately, I cannot elaborate on what those impacts are, but as far as our side, Anglebrook Subdivision, goes, we will make double sure that we are in compliance with the County's regulations. We work closely with the County staff, and they do a fantastic job in terms

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of their reviews, questions, and comments about how the system works. I am certain we would be able to help in some of those situations. I am happy to answer any questions.

Commissioner Randall Dueitt: You believe you may reduce the amount of water flowing with your detention ponds?

Ercil Godwin: I think what is potentially happening with it being undeveloped is that there is nothing to help slow the water down, control it or manage it with constructing detention ponds and stormwater management. We will be able to control that. I cannot speak to how much of that actually affects one of these owners or the next, but as far as our site goes, I think there would be some change for the better.

President Hudson: Mr. Bishop, do you have a question?

Aubrey Bishop: Because they will have these detention ponds, they will get the runoff. I am not talking about that part of it. I am talking about when you get it and release it. It will run on the north side of Cottage Hill Road, which runs right down in front of my house, and then several streams come together, and then you will have some backwater modeling which will force the water more backward, which will increase the flooding in certain areas.

President Hudson: We will let Mr. Godwin respond to that.

Aubrey Bishop: We have to have a release of the detention pond, which water currently drains toward Cottage Hill Road. We cannot redirect stormwater and send it in the opposite direction, but we can control how it is released.

President Hudson: You are following regulations. I think Matthew Barclift, Engineering Development Manager, is prepared to speak and shed some further light on the response to your question.

Matthew Barclift, Engineering Development Manager: I sent Mr. Bishop the preliminary training study of about eighty (80) pages. I don't know if he has had an opportunity to look at it. When the MS4 came into play, the detention requirements were increased.

President Hudson: When was MS4?

Matthew Barclift: Our most recent adoption of MS4 upgrades to our requirements was in 2017.

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President Hudson: That was dealing with stormwater runoff and how it is handled?

Matthew Barclift: Yes.

President Hudson: Federal regulations?

Matthew Barclift: Federal regulations brought through the state. I do not know if Mr. Bishop was able to look at the report closely, but in the initial preliminary plan, you have a ten (10) year storm, a twenty-five (25) year storm, a fifty (50) year storm, and a one hundred (100) year storm. The plan is to detain all the increase due to the one hundred (100) year storm and only release it at the pre-developed ten (10) year storm radius. Tenure is kind of a standard for what we use for all of our roadside drainages. By reducing the after-post-construction runoff from one percent (1%) chance event, which is the one hundred (100) year, then it will prevent the need or the cause of any backwater because it is released at a pre-developed ten (10) year rate.

President Hudson: How do you release it at a slower rate? Do they have to build in certain measures?

Matthew Barclift: There are three (3) to five (5) ponds that extend to the entire southern boundary of this development. There will be a choke point where it will only allow so much water out of the release point of the control structure. At that point, it will control, and only a certain amount of water will be released.

President Hudson: This requirement came into being in 2017 and was not there before these other developments were built. Is that correct?

Matthew Barclift: Yes, ma'am, and I will note that we did not have administrative control over subdivisions until 2018, when the City of Mobile rolled back its planning jurisdiction.

President Hudson: When they released it to us.

Matthew Barclift: Yes, they had control over the approval of subdivisions up until that point.

President Hudson: Okay. I think Mr. Bishop, Mr. Muse, and these other homeowners are looking for a sense of confidence that this development is not going to make an existing problem worse. If they can get some guarantee that this is the case, then I think that would allay a lot of their concerns. Will the MS4 rules that must be complied with now do that?

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Matthew Barclift: I hesitate; there are no guarantees in life.

President Hudson: That is right and true.

Matthew Barclift: I can't stand here and guarantee there will never be a problem.

President Hudson: In your professional opinion, will it alleviate their concerns?

Matthew Barclift: In my professional opinion, it should reduce their concerns.

President Hudson: Please respect the decorum of the meeting; do not speak from the audience.

Commissioner Dueitt: Matthew, we have had this conversation before; what control do we have over this? I am asking Matthew Barclift, Engineering Development Manager, W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer, and Jay Ross, County Attorney, what control we really have if they meet the state, county, and federal regulations? From every time we have had this conversation, I understand that in Mobile County, we have very little control over denying these developers the right to develop these subdivisions. Am I correct about that? I will say what I always say, the same thing that goes back to what Mr. Bishop said: when is it critical? Our schools are overcrowded. They are building a subdivision in a district with the two (2) largest schools in the State of Alabama: Baker High School is the largest enrolled and only second to Hoover High School; Causey Middle School is the largest enrolled in the entire State of Alabama. Beyond that, there is not even a paid fire department in that area. We are stressing our volunteer firefighters and talking about building a subdivision. I understand Mr. Bishop's other concerns. We are stressing all of our public services, particularly public safety, when we continue to build subdivisions. I said all that to say this. The reason I asked those questions is that I have been here before. We have had others with the same concerns as you guys. Ultimately, I want one of them to say it aloud. I see a lot of heads nodding, but I want one of them to say it aloud. What kind of control do we really have on approving or disapproving these subdivisions as long as they meet county, state, and federal regulations?

President Hudson: Jay Ross, County Attorney, can you give us your legal opinion or W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer?

W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer: A state statute states that if a developer meets all of the county's criteria, the county engineer has no option other than to

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recommend approval to the County Commission. We ensure the criteria are met.

President Hudson: Right, the criteria are met, and you recommended it to the County Commission for approval. Now, what yardstick can the County Commission use to decide whether to approve it going forward at this point? Is there liability if we do not approve when the requirements have been met?

W. Bryan Kegley II: Commissioner, we have dramatically increased the drainage criteria as of the MS4 in 2017. Our new criteria require the stipulations Mr. Bishop stated, and they should see a significant improvement.

President Hudson: It may not be completely perfect, but it should be improved over the condition that it is in now.

W. Bryan Kegley II: It is an improvement over undeveloped properties; if they meet all of the criteria. Commissioner, we are obligated to approve the development.

Commissioner Dueitt: I said all of that, so you guys understand the position of Mobile County, particularly with no home rule and zoning requirements. I knew the answer, and we have spoken on the phone numerous times, Mr. Bishop. I hope you understand the County's position. I have told you numerous times on the phone that I am not an engineer. I spend a lot of time in our new subdivisions and on our road developments. I trust the people that work with the County on our staff, including W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer, and Matthew Barclift, Engineering Development Manager, one hundred percent (100%). They will stay on top of this and make sure they are meeting and providing them with everything they need to be in compliance.

Aubrey Bishop: In 2012, we had three-point-three inches of water, and five (5) years later, it was three-point-two inches. It flooded, so I do not know what one hundred (100) years amount of rainfall is. I know we had almost the exact amount in a five (5) year period.

Commissioner Dueitt: When you talk about one hundred (100) years, you also have to take into consideration that two (2) or three (3) weeks back, we had two inches of rain several days in one (1) week, but I get the overall average of one hundred (100) year rainfall.

President Hudson: It might be helpful, Matthew Barclift, Engineering Development Manager, if you would meet with Mr. Bishop to go over the specifics of the MS4 requirements and how the runoff might actually help their situation.

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Commissioner Dueitt: The concern you guys have is my concern, but I also have other concerns regarding public safety, infrastructure, and educating our children.

Richard Wittmann, 2430 Cottage Woods Court, Mobile, Alabama; Anglebrook Subdivision, Agenda Item #48: I want to express my support for Mr. Bishop and to speak for some people of the Cottage Woods Court Subdivision. When the Publix development was done, we had drainage issues. We called and complained; they eventually addressed the issues. The water that will be released will be in my backyard, and I know everyone thinks we are all a bunch of nervous nellys, but we are very worried.

President Hudson: Your concerns are certainly legitimate based on your previous experiences. Based on what Matthew Barclift, Engineering Development Manager, has told us this morning, as well as W. Bryan Kegley II, County Engineer, the new federal discharge regulations hopefully have dramatically changed that picture. In most residential neighborhoods, speaking of someone who built a house recently, MS4 rules have changed everything. I totally understand, and it would be helpful if perhaps you would meet with Matthew Barclift, Engineering Development Manager, after the meeting as well.

Gwyn Howard, 5613 Erhard Drive, Mobile, Alabama: A while back, y'all had sent the police, who told me I could not hold signs anymore in the front of Mobile Government Plaza, which I have been doing for a year. I thought, as long as you brought them and took them every time, it was okay.

President Connie Hudson: You have been holding American flags out there for a long time and are more than welcome. There may have been some issue with political signs stuck in the ground in front of Mobile Government Plaza and were not on your person, nor were you holding them. Signs cannot be left unattended.

Gwyn Howard: I stick them right beside me, and I hold a flag that's what I do. I thought it was part of my personal rights.

President Hudson: If there was a misunderstanding about the signs stuck in the ground and you were some distance away, and they were not yours or on your person, then we apologize.

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Gwyn Howard: I appreciate it.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: What kind of signs were they?

Gwyn Howard: They were political signs of different people I support. If I wanted to get someone out of the office, I would bring a sign with an "x" on their picture or name. It should be up to me. They bring signs up here and lay them out there. What is the difference?

President Hudson: There was definitely a concern. When you are holding the sign and a person is there with the sign, it is a demonstration. If the sign is with you, you certainly have every right to hold it. That is one thing; you are expressing your rights, but if signs are left lying up against a chair or stuck in the ground, and nobody is with the sign, it is considered litter.

Gwyn Howard: I am guilty of leaving them out one time during election week, but I will not do that anymore.

President Hudson: Mr. Howard, we apologize and want to see you back out there.

Gwyn Howard: I will be out there every day if I do not have something else to do with my grandson.

President Hudson: Thank you for patriotism.

Commissioner Randall Dueitt: Can we take the Agenda Item #48 out of order?

President Connie Hudson: Yes.

Commissioner Dueitt: So they can be dismissed if they want to leave.

President Hudson: Can we take Agenda Item #48 out of order?

Glenn L. Hodge, County Administrator: Yes, ma'am.

President Connie Hudson: I was not aware of this item until this morning, when Richard Mitchell, Public Works Director, delivered this to my office. We discussed the critical need for a driveway at the Metro Jail. That's a problem right now, and he explained that we would use County Public Works employees to construct the driveway entrance. He was pulling some workers off of another project, which I certainly understand. I mean, it's a

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matter of priority here, but I think you do not need to pay for it out of your District funds. The Metro Jail serves the whole County.

Commissioner Randall Dueitt: I understand, but they are in critical need, and I am willing to do that.

President Hudson: I understand that. Richard Mitchell, Public Works Director, would you repeat our conversation from this morning?

Richard Mitchell, Public Works Director: For special projects like this, we have to pull away our crews from doing other work to do these special types of projects. We are willing to do that, but with the understanding that we have to go back and do what we were doing before we pulled them off. We do these projects during regular working hours. Sometimes to get the other projects done, we may have to work some overtime. I wanted the Commissioner to understand that we may overrun our overtime dollar amount to get the project done and to make sure he understood that we would charge the materials for this project to the General Fund instead of charging everything.

President Hudson: We should not charge the labor costs to the Commission District Project. However, in the event that overtime is needed, we will make the notation that it is acceptable overtime because of the critical need of this project required it.

Commissioner Merceria Ludgood: As far as I am concerned, this project ought to be paid entirely from General Fund, and whatever adjustments we have to make, we make it at that time.

President Hudson: That is what I discussed with Richard Mitchell, Public Works Director. Apparently, there are some accounting issues with charging one project to the next.

Richard Mitchell: This project will be performed mostly during working hours. So when we go back to perform the work on whatever road we take these crews from, they may have to work overtime on that project. It is difficult to charge that overtime from another project to the Metro Jail. I wanted to make sure the Commissioner was aware that we might have an overage in our overtime line item that needs to be taken into account.

President Hudson: That is kind of what I am saying.

Commissioner Ludgood: Right.

President Hudson: Delete the charge to the Commission District Project. How would the materials be charged?

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Richard Mitchell: The cost of \$1,440.30 will be charged to the GFP023.

President Hudson: That's budgeted?

Commissioner Ludgood: Typically, we would charge the whole thing to General Fund. I have enough confidence in our Finance Department that when we get the overtime or whatever issue it is, they will figure it out. Nobody's not going to be paid their overtime. You are not going to be able to get a project done because you can't charge overtime. This whole thing ought to be a General Fund Project.

Richard Mitchell: Last year, we were not charging labor and equipment; we have only been charging materials for General Fund Projects, Commission District Projects, and Education Fund Projects. The Commissioner asked me to do this, and he said he would pay for our labor and equipment, so we put that on there as requested, but we will not charge that.

President Hudson: There are instances when there is additional labor that we need to cover, and our District funds can do that, but I think in this particular case because it is the Metro Jail, it could be charged to General Funds.

Commissioner Dueitt: I don't disagree with any of that other than it was such a critical need, and just to keep down any trouble, I just said, let's get it done.

Commissioner Ludgood: There is no trouble. There are nuances when it comes to this, and the Metro Jail is not one of those.

Commissioner Dueitt: We had a situation during the construction at the Metro Jail. There were some issues with the parking lot, and it had to be shut down. People are parking all over the street. There was an incident, an emergency at the Metro Jail, and the ambulance and fire truck could not access the area. That is why it all came up, and that is why this all happened.

President Hudson: I know there is a level of comfort with you having been a Sheriff's Deputy, but the Sheriff or Warden or any of the folks over there are more than welcome to contact our offices as well as Administration, and that way, you don't have to feel like you're put in a corner to get this done.

Commissioner Dueitt: I didn't feel like I was put in a corner. I just didn't mind doing that, but thank you.

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President Hudson: With that said, we will approve amending to delete the Commission District Project portion of the funding.

Commissioner Dueitt: Are we going to change it to come out of General Fund?

President Hudson: Right. We're deleting the portion of labor and equipment from the Commission District Project and changing it to General Fund.

Commissioner Dueitt moved, seconded by Commissioner Ludgood, that the Board approve the Public Works Department to construct a new driveway entrance on the parking lot at the Metro Jail. The estimated cost of this proposed work is approximately \$19,303.13, and will be charged to GFP023.

Motion carried unanimously.
