Commission President Connie Hudson: We have a resolution to present today. We will present it to Chandra Scott, Mobile Area Education Foundation, in honor of First U Haf-ta FAFSA Day.

Chandra Scott, Mobile Area Education Foundation:

We had a good time. If you can imagine, the water levels were above flood stage plus 27 feet. That is hard to The hog business up there is horrible. comprehend. Thousands and thousands of pigs were drowned. The roads were covered with fish. I was glad to have been a part of it, anytime you can give back to anything like that it makes it well worthwhile. They will recover; they have a good attitude.
