Mobile County's unique cultural heritage and Civil Rights history presents an exceptional opportunity. The Mobile County Commission's ARPA State and Local Recovery Fund Strategic Spending Plan (Mobile County ARPA Strategic Spending Plan FINAL-corrected (mobilecountyal.gov) includes a "Master Plan For Civil Rights and Cultural Heritage Districts" project that is intended to elevate Mobile's Civil Rights and Cultural Heritage infrastructure and branding to create a community and tourism asset suitable for inclusion on the State of Alabama's Civil Rights Trail. Mobile County is soliciting proposals from qualified firms and individuals interested in providing professional planning, marketing, and design consulting services in conjunction with the development of a comprehensive Master Plan for the Civil Rights and Cultural Heritage District.

Firms/Consultants interested in performing the work will be considered on the basis of their written response to this Request for Proposals. All applicants must submit their Proposals and should list any prior experience with Federal and State programs, or Federal agency related projects, particularly projects similar in nature and scope to the services being requested.

The overall purpose of this project is to develop a comprehensive master plan that defines the physical and programmatic elements of a special district that will serve as the foundation for an area that provides both robust civil rights/cultural heritage tourism opportunities and services to the local community. The results of the planning and design process will culminate in the development of a master plan that includes facilities and infrastructure that are needed to meet the goals and objectives of a functional special purpose district.

The selected consultant will be expected to work with the County, its agents and other consultants, diverse stakeholders, and community members to ensure that projects included the Master Plan are completed in a collaborative, timely, professional, and efficient manner. Project Tasks associated with the comprehensive master planning for the Civil Rights and Cultural Heritage District will include, but not be limited to, the following

- Providing support to, and participating in engagement and communication regarding project activities as deemed appropriate and as directed by the County. This engagement process will inform design concepts.
- Assist with determining what facilities and infrastructure are needed to meet identified objectives and design improvements if requested.
- Develop an inventory and evaluate existing infrastructure and environmental conditions within specific areas of the district.
- Identify additional project needs and requirements and perform engineering and design if requested.

- Assist with identifying development barriers and solutions to promote connection, walkability, and the use of alternative modes of transportation along sites.
- Develop an inventory and evaluate the identified sites with existing infrastructure and environmental conditions.

The evaluation factors to be used during award selection(s) are as follows: Previous Performance/Experience - 0-30 Points; Project Manager - 0-15 Points; Key Staff and Sub-consultants - 0-10 Points; Available Resources and Location - 0-10 Points; Project Methodology and Approach - 0-35 Points.
